

#### **BAWDESWELL STORE**

We were all sad to see Shirley and Andy leave the Bawdeswell Stores. None of us like change and therefore I have waited before writing this letter in order to ensure that it is objective. In the past my family and I have bought a major proportion of our weekly consumables in the shop - approximately £30-£50 a week on bread, cold meats and cheese, fruit and vegetables, animal food and stationery

Whilst a village store must of course provide the "treats" which are enjoyable but not essential to a family budget, the balance seems to have swung away from the basic necessities we all need.

The balance of goods stocked has swung to items of poor nutritional content which at best should be occasional treats. The long term viability of the shop is in doubt if other families' pattern of local spending has changed as dramatically as my own. We are currently spending less than £10 a week there as it no longer meets our needs. I hope that the manager (who I still have not met) listens to the views of local residents. We all want to support him and his staff and to see the shop continue to thrive, but I for one will not be buying sweets, soft drinks or ready meals to extent that I used to buy basic commodities. 





Our book choice for the July meeting is "Behind the Scenes at the Museum" by Kate Atkinson.

Our last book choice was " The Vanishing Act of Esme Lennox " by Maggie O'Farrell.

This was a multi-faceted tale of a rather unconventional and spirited girl who, through a combination of circumstances, is admitted to a psychiatric hospital at the age of 16. As an old lady she is released into the care of a niece who had previously been unaware of her existence and can discover nothing from her grandmother, Esme's sister Kitty, as she has Alzheimers.

We learn gradually of Esme's early childhood in India with her much loved Sister, Kitty, her cold and disapproving parents and, later, an adored baby brother who dies from typhoid and has to be taken, forcibly, from her arms.

Shortly afterwards the family move back home to Scotland where the girls have to deal with another stern adult in the form of their grandmother, but, whilst Kitty is biddable, Esme continues to rebel and, in a state of shock following rape, is admitted to hospital by her parents for the "crime" of being found dancing in front of a mirror in her mother's clothes.

The story continues following the fortunes of Esme's niece, Iris, and her stepbrother, Alex, as well as Esme's eventual meeting with her sister, with many discoveries along the way and a shocking conclusion.

Most of us enjoyed this book though it was considered by some to be rather contrived and unbelievable.

Then Teleshopping could help!


Teleshopping is an innovative new shopping service. It is just one of several services managed by 'At Home Not Alone'. Clients will be asked for an initial shopping list and then we will arrange for a local shop, accredited by Norfolk Home Call, to deliver all their groceries at a time to suit them. If they need help with unpacking this will be done by the driver or one of our volunteers. After an initial shop we will ring once a fortnight to get a shopping order.

**Eligibility** - Anyone over the age of 65 can sign up to become a member of the Teleshopping service, or anyone over the age of 50 referred by Adult Social Services.

How to access the service - The cost is £10 a quarter. (£40 per year). The only additional cost may be a small delivery charge made by the shops, but all members will be advised of all available shops and their charges when they join. This service can also be set up as part of a new care package, if your need is identified for shopping support by Social Services. Teleshopping is available countywide.

Dear Everybody, hello again.

This month represents a milestone for me. I shall have been a priest for 25 years. There are lots of milestones in our lives, but sometimes they represent change, and sometimes they show how little has changed.

One thing that hasn't changed is the group of spiritual functions that a priest must perform; to bless, to forgive, and to celebrate Holy Communion, all in God's name. Much of the day-to-day work remains the same.

But there have been lots of changes over the years as well. Twenty-five years ago many Church of England parishes had their own priest, or maybe were linked with only one other. Many of the Methodist chapels in villages still continued to function. Some pubs, shops, and schools that have now gone were still open.

I was fortunate, though, that I grew up in the Burnham group of parishes, with the same pattern of a number of churches with one rector that we have here. It was already my idea of rural ministry, so maybe I'm old fashioned, or maybe I grew up ahead of my time.

Expectations have changed, and many employment practices from the business world – and from Europe – are creeping into the way that we do things. This is both good and bad, as it tends to make things averagely better all round, but to make excellence less likely.

It continues to be a great privilege to me to be a priest. I hope that I will be able to serve all the communities of which I am Rector well for many years to come. In former times, I could have been here for another 25 years and more, but now, for your sake and mine, they retire clergy when we begin to get past it. Thank you for having me here.
