



With a background of ancient meadowland, the relaxed cottage garden style of planting here has something to offer at each season. Masses of Spring bulbs, Hellebores and Cyclamen Coum give way to the heady scents of Summer Roses, Shrubs and Herbaceous Borders. In Autumn Colchicums and Cyclamen Neapolitanum appear under a canopy of colourful leaves.

One path leads to a pergola which supports Clematis and Jasmine. Elsewhere alpines grow in the rockery and in various troughs and planters. Some distance away a large natural pond is home to a family of moorhens which raise several broods each year.

The vegetable garden is divided by gravel paths and edged with Rose and Clematis covered trellis. Not far away a shady dell with seating offers somewhere to rest awhile.



BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL EXTRACTS OF MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 2nd APRIL 2007 AT 7.45pm IN THE VILLAGE HALL

PRESENT: Councillor's Hind, Mallen, Cockburn, Swain and Beane 17 parishioners Mr.G. Bambridge (DC)

BEFORE THE MEETING STARTED THE CHAIRMAN, DR. G. HIND. THANKED THE CLERK AND COUNCILLORS FOR ALL THEIR HARD WORK OVER THE PAST FOUR YEARS AND ALSO THANKED PARISHIONERS FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT DURING HIS PERIOD AS CHAIRMAN. HE HOPED THAT THIS SUPPORT WOULD CONTINUE FOR THE NEW COUNCILLORS AFTER THE MAY ELECTION.

APOLOGIES: Councillors Lilwall and Wallace. Mrs. Floering Blackman MINUTES OF LAST MEETING; Agreed and signed PLANNING:

-Rear of Denver House – new dwelling and garage. / The Homestead, Reepham Road – construction of side porch extension to replace existing canopy. No Objections to these two PA's

-Dale Paddocks, Reepham Road – proposed erection of three stables and formation of exercise area. Clerk to query whether PP is required for 6ft. panel fencing and wrought iron gates already in place. Objections- very bad site with dangerous bend - awkward for getting horses/horse boxes out of driveway. Could cause serious problems. -Fairstead Homes, Reepham Road – detached house (amended design) – only objection was to request for property to be moved back around 8 metres or so as this would be outside Village boundary/ building line and would set precedent if any

further properties were built in that location.

-T-Mobile – installation of new 20m. high tower, ground based cabinets and development ancillary thereto. Objections – spoil area of outstanding natural beauty – local amenity used by people in the village and surrounding area for walks/horse riding – intrusion into countryside and tower would be seen for miles around. Roman Road is of historial/archaeological interest and well documented – it is felt that a full archaeological search should be undertaken and PC assume T-Mobile are prepared to carryout a full search of the whole roadway from Reepham Road to the Tower. Concerns about health risks and possible effects of emissions and radiation.
-Rendering Plant at Clay Hall Farm, Gt. Witchingham – letters of objection sent to Breckland/ Broadland/NCC. (Broadland will discuss this PA 19th April).
-6 Wind Turbines. Skitfield Road, Guestwick – following a successful High Court challenge, the Court has ordered that the Planning Inspectorate determine the Appeal again. Letter of objection sent.

-Complaints about dog mess in The Street - Dog Warden to be informed.

AS THE PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS TAKE PLACE ON THURSDAY 3RD MAY THE NEXT MEETING WILL BE ON MONDAY 14th MAY STARTING AT 7.15PM. IN THE VILLAGE HALL.

The Bawdeswell Annual Parish Meeting will be held at 7.15pm on Monday 14th May in the Village Hall. This is an open meeting for ALL parishioners. You will be able to meet the new Parish Council members and voice your views/feelings about the Village and its future.

This meeting will be followed by the Annual Parish Council Meeting and election of officers and then by an ordinary Parish Council Meeting.

As there are only 6 nominations for the Parish Council there will be no election but the District Council Election is still on. Those nominated for the Parish Council and by default appointed are: Carl Beane, David Cockburn, Mark Hipperson*, James Lilwall, David Shannon* and Graham Swain (* new member). There will be an opportunity during the Annual Parish Council Meeting for one further person to be co-opted onto the council.

Just because there is an annual meeting this doesn't mean that you can't be heard at any normal Parish Council meeting. Parishioners are encouraged to attend every meeting and bring their views and concerns. Comments are also invited on planning applications and other issues. Meetings are held normally on the first Monday of the month except January and August. The Parish Council Precept (the amount that the Parish Council raises through Council Tax) is set at the meeting in December.

STREET SCENE

One of the biggest complaints received by Breckland Council each year is that of 'dog fouling' - owners allowing their dogs to foul the public highway and public areas and failing to clean up the mess.

We've designated our land a 'poop scoop' area under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996. This applies to any land which is open to the air and which the public have access to. If a dog fouls on this land and the person in charge of the dog doesn't clear it up, they are guilty of an offence.

We can give a Fixed Penalty Notice (£50.00) to anyone who commits this offence and if they don't pay the Fixed Penalty Notice within 14 days of receipt they could be prosecuted and receive a maximum fine of £1000.

If you know anyone who is committing an offence under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996, please contact the Breckland Dog Warden on 01362 656299. We want to keep our beautiful area pleasant for everyone to use. All information we receive will be treated as confidential.

WENSUM VALLEY BIRDWATCHING SOCIETY

When we were youngsters, some 50 years ago, we collected stamps and birds eggs. I still have my stamps but I am happy to report that my egg collection has long gone. Which is just as well after hearing Nicholas Crampton, a lawyer from the Crown Prosecution Service, who gave a talk on Fighting Wildlife Crime. Nicholas, who has ten years experience of prosecuting wildlife crime, outlined the various acts which have been introduced for the protection of wildlife starting as far back as 1822. He listed a range of threatened species which come under the act such as Badgers, Bats, Raptors and also plants, such as Bluebells and Snowdrops. Penalties for wildlife crime have become more severe and a recent case of a local man, who received a 6½ year jail sentence for trafficking in endangered birds of prey, was given as an example. Nicholas also spoke about protection laws in the Mediterranean particularly Malta and Cyprus where he felt that steady progress was being made. An interesting and reassuring talk.

The Wensum Valley Project, established in 1988 to conserve wildlife, were very supportive of us when we formed our society. They have now decided to become a charitable trust to take over the work of the Wensum Valley project and would welcome anyone with an interest in the Wensum Valley to help launch this exciting new start for the trust. NEW ORGAN? - We are very fortunate to have installed in the church, for a short time only, a state of the art *Makin* digital organ.


The present pipe organ was originally built 1901 for Shotesham House and was rebuilt here in 1954, fitted with a new case, designed by J Fletcher Watson.

It has always been very limited with only 12 speaking stops across two manuals and pedal. The organ has a high pitch, which makes it impossible to use with other instruments. It's voicing was originally scaled to the more intimate surroundings of the drawing room in Shotesham House, so provides little support to the congregational singing.

After such long service the organ is in urgent need of rebuilding to provide an instrument with integrity that can enhance our worship and musical life of the Church.

Organ Builders Makin are putting together a scheme that would provide the church with a new instrument within the current case, replacing the old console with a new one positioned in the gallery as now. We will evaluate it to see if it is a scheme that we could gain approval for and try and raise the necessary funds sometime in the future, if that is the decision.

Do come and listen to the demonstration organ.

From Tides & Seasons by David Adam

Risen Again

Let the earth proclaim The joy of your Name.

Let each bulb rejoice, Its growth be a voice.

Let each seed and flower Tell of your power.

Let the glowing bright sun Show the deed that is done.

Let us hear from the rain He is risen again.

Let all repeat the refrain He is risen again. Dear Everybody, hello again.

The incident where fifteen sailors were captured by the Iranians shows how damaging publicity can be. The sailors were pawns in a propaganda skirmish which the Brits resoundingly lost. What was very clear, though, was that the same story was not being told by the different sides. There was the truth, and there were the stories.

The press have been enjoying the rumpus about whether the sailors ought to have sold their story. The rumpus is good copy, especially with the possibility of ministerial resignations attached. But hold on. The sailors have sold their stories to the press, it's the press that have sold the stories to us. The sailors are also pawns in a circulation war between the newspapers. As far as the small world of the press is concerned, they can try to get propaganda coups over their rivals in the same way that countries can.

We may think, sometimes, that it's important to get our side of a particular story across, but it doesn't always work that way. Dealing with slander and libel in the courts is notoriously chancy. And when you see a press retraction of a story, it's a twentieth of the size of the original, tucked away in an inside page. It can be worse than useless to try to justify yourself, or correct a story. This can lead people to doubt the truth of anything that they hear; or else, to believe anything and everything, as long as it's bad.

The earliest Christians had that problem with their bizarre story of someone rising from the dead. Often it was treated as spin, or "they would say that, wouldn't they?" All religions now face the problem of being seen as one story among many. But somewhere out there, there is truth. And in the end, we are not justified – or otherwise – by what people think about us, but by the Truth.
