FOXLEY PARISH COUNCIL - EXTRACT OF MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON 12TH MAY 2010, IN THE VILLAGE HALL

<u>Present:</u> Councillors Harvey (Chairman), Mears (Vice-Chairman), Barrett, Hatch, Mr B Borrett (County Councillor), Mr G Bambridge (District Councillor), C Boer and 5 Parishioners

Matters Arising

<u>Donation to Project Bawdeswell:</u> Following a presentation made by Mrs Fel Roberts from Project Bawdeswell about the redevelopment of the Children's Play Area in Bawdeswell and her request for financial support to help with this project, the Parish Council, whilst having sympathy for the children of Foxley as there is no play area within this village and there is evidence supplied by Mrs Roberts that these children do use the facilities in Bawdeswell, the Parish Council's budget for this financial year has already been fixed and all funds are accounted for. The Chairman therefore asked Mrs Roberts to produce a list of items that could be added to the play area at a later stage and the Parish Council would consider giving financial support to this project when agreeing the budget for next year in December.

<u>Anglian Water Sewerage Pumping Station:</u> The Chairman reported that Anglian Water officials have advised him that 10 residents in East Foxley and 20 residents in West Foxley have signed up to the first time sewerage scheme. Concerns were raised about the damage to verges and road surfaces and whether these will be adequately repaired following the works. The Parish Council will continue to monitor this.

<u>Highway Issues:</u> The Clerk reported that during the recent Police Surgery held in Bawdeswell Village Hall in March, the question had been asked about the possible provision of a flashing 50mph speed sign on the A1067. The PCSO confirmed that she will raise this concern and would ask for this section of road to have some speed spot checks conducted in the future. The Chairman agreed to send a letter to Norfolk Police to reiterate the Parish Council's concerns about motorists using this section of road at far higher speeds and how it is proving dangerous for pedestrians crossing this road. Parishioners who are also concerned about this issue are urged to raise this with the Dereham Safer Neighbourhood Team Tel: 0845 456 4567 or email <u>sntdereham@norfolk.pnn.police.uk</u>. The broken barrier at the end of Chapel Road has been reported to Highways.

Planning

<u>PA 3PL/2010/0305/F</u>: Construction of double garage & Carport – amended scheme 3PL/2009/2030/F at Longacre, Chapel Road. The Parish Council commented on the size of this proposal and that Breckland District Council should consider the proposed planning application at the former Natterjack site when considering this application.

BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL DIGEST OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - 11 MAY 2010

<u>Present:</u> Councilors Shannon, Mason, Beane, Lilwall, Mallen, Kirby, Green, Mr G Bambridge (District Councilor) and Mrs C Boer.

Ongoing Issues from Previous Meetings

Adams Pit: As requested, Mr E Stocker (Ecologist) at Norfolk County Council, has provided the Trustees (Parish Councillors) with a plan for the next stage of refurbishment work at Adams Pit. This includes advice on the depths required around the pond following excavation works, the design of a dipping platform on the southem edge of the pond and the creation of islands within the pond for birds and water voles. The Clerk will now obtain competitive quotes from contractors to meet Mr Stocker's plan, with the aim of starting excavation work in late July/early August when the water level will be at its lowest and birds will have finished nesting.

<u>Allotments:</u> The Chairman and Clerk have not been able to meet with the second local landowner to discuss possible land for allotments, but it is hoped this meeting will take place before the next Parish Council meeting in July.

Any Other Business of Interest to Parishioners

Bus Shelter Repairs: Following the request from NCC, the Clerk obtained 3 quotes for the required bus shelter repairs, the lowest of which was accepted by the Parish Council. The

repair work should commence shortly, and it is hoped that the Parish Council will receive some financial support from NCC to help with the cost.

<u>Flex-ibus Dial-A-Ride</u>: The Clerk is still pursuing the Parish Council's request for NCC officials to attend a future Parish Council meeting to discuss the public transport needs of Bawdeswell parishioners following the completed 2009 transport questionnaires. It is hoped that this will eventually incorporate Bawdeswell into the Flexi-bus Dial-A-Ride system, so providing a wider service for all parishioners. Details of when NCC officials will attend a Parish Council meeting will be advertised on the Parish Council notice board; parishioners are urged to attend this meeting to assist the Parish Council in voicing support for the scheme.

<u>Recycling Credit</u>: As a result of a request received from the Bawdeswell Little Monkey's Mother and Toddler Group, the Parish Council agreed to donate £150.00 from the £476.01 received from Breckland Council for recycling carried out in Bawdeswell during 2009-2010, to help towards the cost of a static room divider for the babies of the group. The remaining £326.01 will be held over in Parish Council accounts until any further needs from local community groups or village projects are established and agreed.

Land in Front of Folland Court: Three suggestions have been received about the future use of this land: a memorial garden for those who have fallen in conflict; a small recycling centre, or the existing grassed area of land. Having debated all three options, the Parish Council agreed that the area should become a simple memorial garden, and the Clerk has therefore been commissioned to obtain landscaping ideas and associated quotes for the Parish Council to consider further. In the meantime, the Parish Council has agreed not take over the maintenance of this area until the current legal difficulties on future ownership of the land have been sorted out between Breckland District Council and the Peddars Way Housing Association.

By sharing information with the police allowing them to be intelligence-led.



BAWDESWELL BOOK CLUB

We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are reading <u>The Suspicions of Mr. Whicher</u> by Kate Summerscale for discussion at the June meeting and <u>The Secret Agent</u> by Joseph Conrad for discussion at the July meeting..

The Suspicions of Mr Whicher or the Murder at Road Hill House by Kate Summerscale

The book is an intriguing combination of police procedural, Victorian murder mystery and a thoroughly researched exposition of English society in the second half of the 19th-century viewed from a 21st-century perspective. It is a true story concerning the distressing murder of a young boy in the family home whilst all are asleep. Inspector Jonathan Whicher was one of the very first detectives - at the time there were only eight of them in total, all based at Scotland Yard and working almost exclusively in London; he was sent to Wiltshire to investigate the murder. This notorious case was the subject of national speculation at the time and sensationalist coverage in the press. It is considered that this case and indeed the character of a tough, experienced, unpredictable detective was the very beginning of modern detective fiction.

By treating the plethora of facts with a strong narrative voice and through the use of suspense we considered that the author has succeeded in producing a book with the drive of a work of fiction.

At 360 pages long including 55 pages of references it is a book full of background information, sources and data. Some of the group felt that in the middle of the book the narrative drive meandered somewhat and the book could have been shorter; others enjoyed the wealth of contextual detail. All thought that it was a worthwhile read and gave an insight - albeit through the wrong end of a long telescope - into the life and mores of the 1860s. JB



At long last we have managed to obtain, albeit second-hand, a Notice Board, now clearly visible by the path at the western end of the churchyard. It has been adapted for us, free of charge by Billy Taylor of North Elmham and installed by Nicky Mears and his assistants. A donation has been received for the extra materials needed. All useful information about our church activities and services will be available for all to see.

Things are looking promising, too, for the revival of Foxley's long tradition of bell ringing. From the Rector

Dear Everybody, hello again.

The theme for the children's summer club this year is "Heroes". Superheroes have become part of our culture through comics and films. We like the idea of having special powers, especially when they are based in strength or skill, but for children they can also seem like magic.

It's interesting the kinds of names that get chosen. "Captain America", "Captain Fantastic", "Spiderman", "Wonder Woman". They imply authority or strength. But somehow, "Lieutenant Lyng", "Brigadier Bawdeswell" or even "Field Marshal FLEBBS" don't have the same kind of ring to them.

It would be so nice to be able to solve problems by being other than the people we are. I'd love to be able to clean up the mess in the Gulf of Mexico quickly in a superman kind of way. I'm really glad not to be Robert Green at the moment, having to live down *that* goal – yes, how do you become a hero again?

Heroism is about ordinary people doing extraordinary things. *Super*heroes are already extraordinary people, it's natural for them to do what other people couldn't even attempt. What makes us heroic is the decision to do what is difficult or dangerous – some of the greatest heroes didn't succeed in what they attempted, but their heroism is about trying.

If we wait to try to do difficult things until we are thoroughly prepared and ready – or until everybody else is doing it anyway – then we may be being sensible rather than heroic. And heroic doesn't always have to be big scale. To forgive others who have done you a great wrong, to live simply for the sake of others, to focus on the needs of your children and grand children rather than your own: all these things can be heroism. Dare to be extraordinary. And don't mind if others dare to too, it'll make the world a better place.
