# Village Cinema Got Our Grant

BAG has got a Grassroots Grant through Norfolk Community Foundation to purchase a screen, projector, DVD player and sound equipment for the village hall. We are currently awaiting the cheque and hope to have purchased and installed the equipment by the end of May. The screen, speakers and cabling will be permanently installed so that the projector, DVD player and amplifier can be brought to the hall and set up in a few minutes. For the two previous film nights we had to collect the equipment from Sheringham or Wells-next-the-Sea having booked it some weeks in advance. Now that we have our own equipment we are planning a film night once a month and, all being well, our opening night will be Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> June. We are also planning children's films during the summer holidays



#### Bawdeswell Village Hall Entertainment Licence

Bawdeswell Village Hall Committee is applying for a variation to their entertainment licence for the hall which will also include the recreation ground. This is because the number of events that can be held where a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is required is only 12 which limits the number of functions that can be held. The TEN also costs £21 each time one is applied for. The licence is for the following activities.

The performance of plays, showing of films, playing of indoor sports, provision of live and recorded music, performance of dance and other activities similar to these. The provision of entertainment facilities for the making of music, dancing and other activities similar to these. The sale of alcohol for consumption at organised events.

All of the above between 0800 and 2400.

The provision of late night refreshments from 2300 to 0030.

An extra 2 hours to be added to the terminal hour any Friday, Saturday or Sunday of any Bank Holiday weekend and also on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, and also for the May Ball event which would be on a date notified to the licensing authority (and local residents) at least 14 days in advance.

Activities on the recreation ground will be strictly limited to Bawdeswell Village Community organisations only for functions such as the Annual Fete at the end of June, the occasional Bawdeswell Ball in May and the 'Roc at the Rec' concert normally held in July.

Where alcohol is to be sold, this will have to be approved in each case by the Village Hall Committee and strict terms and conditions will be applied.

When we have submitted our application, blue notices will be posted at the hall and recreation ground for 28 days during which anyone can make an objection. An advert will also be placed in the Dereham & Fakenham Times.

#### Planning Application for Portable Building

Bawdeswell Village Hall Committee is considering applying for planning permission for a portable building to be placed alongside the hall. This would be used as a meeting room, for storage and as a changing room for the soccer club.

# BAWDESWELL BOOK CLUB

Our last book choice was 'Fathers & Sons' by Richard Madeley.

I was not a viewer of the 'Richard and Judy' show and on the odd occasion I have seen Richard Madeley on television I have not been impressed. I was therefore not looking forward to reading this book which I suspected would be a sentimental autobiography. I was wrong. I thought the content was interesting and the book was well written in an easy informal style.

The book tells the history of three generations of Madeley fathers. It opens with the story of Richard's grandfather when a ten-year-old child, waking up on his uncle's farm, to find he has been abandoned by his parents, who have emigrated to Canada to start a new life with his six brothers and sisters but without him. The effect this has on Richard's grandfather's and father's life and on his own childhood is told with understanding rather than bitterness which much of the focus being on the social changes in family life, and in particular, the role of the father, that has taken place over the last century.

The overall opinion of book club members was that it was a pleasant, easy read but it would have been more interesting to know how the life of the family members who moved to Canada contrasted with his grandfather's.

#### BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL DIGEST OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 12 APRIL 2010

<u>Present:</u> Councillors Shannon, Mason, Beane, Lilwall, Mallen, Mr B Borrett (District Councillor), C Boer and 2 parishioners.

#### Ongoing Issues from Previous Meetings

Vacancy for Parish Councillor – PC agreed unanimously to co-opt Shaun Green as new Parish Councillor.

<u>Adams Pit:</u> An adjacent landowner has now lowered the depth of the drain from Adams Pit at his own expense, as agreed by the Trustees and, as a result, the water level in Adams Pit has been reduced significantly. Volunteers have now burnt all of the remaining detritus left from the final stage of tree surgery, and have planted hedging on the western side of the Adams Pit. As a result of the Countryside Conservation grant application submitted by the Trustees, Norfolk County Council has covered 40% of the total cost incurred to complete this first phase of work to refurbish Adams Pit. Further work will now be delayed until September due to the wildlife breeding season, but the Trustees will continue creating a business plan for the remainder of the work.

<u>Allotments:</u> The Chairman and Clerk recently met with one local landowner to discuss possible land for allotments. Unfortunately, the landowner in question has other plans for the land expressed as being the Parish Council's preferred choice, but he does have an alternative potential site for allotments, albeit this would be expensive and pose logistical and road safety problems. With this in mind, the Parish Council will pursue the final two options of acquiring land before a decision is finally made.

#### <u>Planning</u>

<u>PA 3PL/2010/0058/LB and 3PL/2010/0059/F</u>: proposed new swimming pool at Bawdeswell Hall, planning permission granted with 7 conditions.

#### Finance

<u>Annual Review of Salaries:</u> The Parish Council agreed to increase the Clerk's salary to £2,450 per annum and adjust the monthly contractual hours from 18.5hrs to 20hrs a month with effect 1 April 2010.

#### Any Other Business of Interest to Parishioners

<u>Project Bawdeswell Governance:</u> In October 2009, the Parish Council agreed (subject to further clarification) with proposals to move the governance of Project Bawdeswell within that of a widened and re-named Village Hall Charity. However, subsequent advice and experience with the Play Area grant suggests that Project Bawdeswell can best continue as an enabler and catalyst for its project vision without any formal change to its original governance arrangements. Accordingly, The Parish Council endorsed the original governance structure for project Bawdeswell. In future, when grant applications are to be made related to project Bawdeswell, an appropriate body to make the application will be identified at the outset and Project Bawdeswell will work with that body to make the application a success.

<u>Childrens Play Area</u>: Work is almost complete on the new childrens' play area. However, while it looks great, the surfaces need time to settle in and for the grass to grow. Now it's time to seek the additional funding and competitive quotes necessary to refurbish the adjacent toddler area. It is anticipated all sections of the new play area will be complete in time for a formal opening ceremony at the Village Fete.

<u>Potholes:</u> The potholes in the Street have appeared again! The Clerk has reported this to Norfolk County Council, and it is hoped to effect the necessary repairs in the very near future. <u>Improvement to the X29 bus route between Fakenham and Norwich:</u> As from 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2010, Norfolk Green introduced the following changes to the above bus route.

- During the daytime buses will run every hour to and from Norwich, leaving Bawdeswell at or soon after twenty to each hour and the City at or soon after quarter to each hour.
- Due to overloading problems, which have emerged as free pass holders start to travel after 8.30am, an extra bus from Bawdeswell is being introduced to Norwich at 9am.
- During the afternoon peak period, from 3.45pm to 5.45pm Mon-Fri, buses will leave Norwich every thirty minutes, so complementing inbound buses to Norwich which leave the village at about 6.55am, 7.30am and 7.55am.

<u>Community Litter Pick Rangers</u>: The Billingford Community Rangers would like to encourage and extend their fine example of litter clearance in that village by finding volunteers from Bawdeswell to help clear litter from the grass verges within the Parish of Bawdeswell, particularly along the shared Billingford Road. Anyone interested in starting the Bawdeswell Community Rangers and/or those willing to spare a couple of hours a month to help with this community project please contact the Bawdeswell Parish Clerk.

Date of next meeting is: the Annual Parish Council Meeting will be held on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2010 in the Village Hall at 7.45pm, followed immediately by the May Parish Council Meeting.

A reminder that the Annual <u>Parish</u> Meeting will take place on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May at 6.30pm in the Village Hall. This is not a Parish Council meeting but is a more of a general forum for the whole village. As such, it is your opportunity to find out what is going on in and around the village and to raise any issues for discussion; the latter should be forwarded to the Parish Clerk before 10<sup>th</sup> May to add to the agenda. Local activity groups operating in Bawdeswell have been invited to bring along publicity material and chat to individuals after the main meeting, when refreshments will also be available.

# **BAWDESWELL WEATHER STATION**

If you look at www.bawdeswell.net (online home of The Reeve's Tale and all things Bawdeswell) you will see, at the bottom right, a little weather icon which varies from sun to rain and between night and day. If you click on the icon, you will reach a page of lots more weather detail. The current weather information comes from a weather station situated next to the recreation ground. The station records temperature, humidity, wind speed and direction, rainfall and barometric pressure (adjusted to sea level). The program monitoring the station records gusts as well as average wind speed and also calculates wind-chill and an index which indicates what the weather "feels like", each of which can be quite different from the actual temperature. Forecasts for the next few days come from the Weather Underground web service. The information on the web is updated every hour (except when technical glitches occur). This includes the icon on the Bawdeswell.net page, which shows the current temperature and the likely weather over the next 12 hours or so, based on the temperature and pressure readings. The station has now been running for about 2 years and I hope you enjoy looking at it, even if not the weather itself.



# THE GENERAL ELECTION MAY 6<sup>th</sup>

There has been a readjustment of constituency boundaries. After 13 years representing Mid Norfolk, Conservative Keith Simpson has moved to fight the 2010 election in the new Broadland seat.

George Freeman, 42, is hoping to pick up the blue baton in the new Mid Norfolk of which we are part.

Mr Freeman, who runs a small business and also set up The Norfolk Way organisation, has made himself high-profile and got involved with campaigns from saving local Post Offices to opposing a giant sub-station plan.

Labour's candidate is Elizabeth Hughes, currently a local councillor in Hounslow, west London, and she has also been getting out in the area well before the election was declared.

She stood in North Essex seat in 2005 and was beaten by an 11,000 majority by the incumbent Bernard Jenkin.

Brought up in Hounslow, where she currently lives with her husband, the 45-year-old technical manager with Proctor and Gamble said she would move to Norfolk if she were elected.

She has been meeting a wide range of people from Breckland Council's top brass to local union officials to youth councillors to the local Family Carers' Group to representatives of the Portuguese community.

Timothy Birt, 44, a town councillor in Dereham, is the Green Party candidate and is an electronics engineer who has developed a fast electric sports car for the Ecotricity company.

The Liberal Democrats have been very low-profile in Mid Norfolk . Their candidate is David Newman, an elected Councillor from Southsea in Hampshire.

Richard Coke - better known as Toby - is representing UKIP. He was born at Weasenham and in 2005 opened the Extreeme Adventure high ropes centre on the edge of the village.

The BNP's Christene Kelly is also standing.

Our Polling Station will be **Bawdeswell Village Hall** and the polling booths will be open between 7am and 10pm.

## Tales From the Past

As promised last month The Bawdeswell & Foxley plane crashes.

A Mosquito aircraft from 608 Squadron from *RAF Downham Market*, was returning from Gelsenkirchen in Germany on 6th November 1944 and crashed on Bawdeswell church.


Cloud and icing conditions were encountered . KB364 became severely iced-up during the descent through cloud over Norfolk , and the pilot was unable to maintain height. The aircraft hit some electricity cables in the Reepham Road and struck All Saints Church, setting it on fire. Parts of the aircraft carried on and hit Barwick House and Chaucer House opposite, causing considerable damage to both. The Reepham, and Dereham Fire Brigades and a crash crew from the American airbase at Attlebridge (Weston Longville) attended and it took four hours to control the blaze.

Stephanie Leitch (nee Bugdale) was 8yrs old at the time, living at Kenway cottage in the Street - "I remember seeing one of the plane's wheels, on fire, rolling down the street towards us. Since this was a few moments after the impact - we had time to come out to see the source of the noise - the wheel must have landed on Barwick House and from there rolled down onto the road. There was, incidentally, a fire appliance behind Chaucer House, where Mr Lloyd Lewis had a workshop. Unluckily the flaming debris blocked access to it."

John Frankland who still lives in Bawdeswell was 10 at the time: "My older brother Ben was at a Youth Club at the School. From our doorstep down the Dereham Road, my Dad who was the Leading Village fireman saw a fire in the distance. 'It can't be Bawdeswell or the phone would have rung', he said. He didn't know the telephone exchange had been hit. My brother came rushing home on his bike and said, 'Come on, Dad, the village is on fire!' The church and two houses were ablaze and the village fire tender was garaged in the corrugated building to the back of the houses. It was a while before they could get it out and then the hoses were too short to reach the pit across the meadow. There was no water main at that time. Reepham Fire Engine came but couldn't get past the downed electricity cables. Eventually Dereham Fire Engine arrived with some extra hoses. Sadly the airmen died but miraculously nobody else was hurt."

In July 1944 two Liberator bombers of the American Air force collided to the East of Foxley and crashed in a field just to the West of the village. John Parfitt of Foxley was young at the time but remembers the horror of the wreckage. Three survivors did parachute to safety but eleven crewmen perished. Paul Davis as a boy found bits of the aircraft in a field this side of Foxley Wood.

## From the Rector

Dear Everybody, hello again.

So we are told that, after the economy, people's main preoccupation in the election is immigration. Indeed, some of the concern about immigration may be economic: do migrants put a burden on resources and the welfare state, or do they add skills and value?

After Easter, I stayed with two English friends who had retired to France. She has been elected to the local *commune*, (like a parish council but with much greater budget and powers), he belongs to a charity teaching backward (French) children maths. They believe in putting something back into the community.

They said that a large number of ex-pat English in the area don't bother to learn French, set up clubs based on English hobbies, and only have social engagements with each other and not the locals. I wonder how many of those ex-pat English emigrated from England because *they* thought that their home country was spoiled by immigrants who didn't bother to learn the language and wanted to preserve an enclave with the culture of "back home".

Some politicians are talking about testing migrants for what they will put into the community. But hold on a moment. Almost all of us are not living in the houses in which we were born, many of us have moved into Norfolk. We've migrated, nearly all of us, just not so far, and we didn't have any problems of nationality or language (though I hear quite a few people complaining how difficult broad Norfolk is to understand).

What would happen if the parish council were allowed to ask, before you bought or rented a house: "What will you offer the community? Do you understand the local language and culture? Are you coming here because you want your life to be like it used to be somewhere else, or do you want to become part of a living and changing community?"

Christians should be concerned for social justice and the welcome of strangers as much as for the preservation of traditions. All of us need to be even-handed when we think about large issues.
