



REVIEW The Bone Setter's Daughter by Amy Tam

We re-read this novel, which was the first book read by the Book Club when it was inaugurated 10 years ago. On the whole it was felt it did not improve with re-reading in fact quite the opposite. Some of us confessed we didn't remember anything about it, but ten years is a long time, especially when memory loss is becoming chronic! It was agreed by all that the first half of the book, when the American Chinese narrator is describing the routine of her daily life in California with her partner and his two daughters, was pretty boring because no one cared at all about them or their lives. The second half of the book coming under the genre - the immigrant's history and journey to America, when the narrator relates the story of her mother's life growing up near Beijing, most members agreed, was more interesting.

The mother, Gaoling, lived through tumultuous times in Chinese history. Unknown to her, her biological mother was her nursemaid "Precious Auntie" and it was she that was the bone setter's daughter of the title. Gaoling's upbringing included lots of ghost stories and superstitions which never deserted her. Eventually she was placed in an Orphanage where she blossomed. Here she met supportive American women, a wise Chinese teacher and his educated son who was then working on the excavation of Peking Man's remains. He became her husband, was ambushed to join the opposing forces and never seen again. Sometime later she made it to Hong Kong and then to the US, married a Doctor, had the child that eventually told her and her mother's story, was widowed, became a bit of a Tiger mother, and continued to live with her demons. Her daughter, the narrator, gained from learning her history which gave her some broader understanding. On the whole it was a bit of a "soap opera"! M.M.

BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL DIGEST OF MEETING HELD ON 5th NOVEMBER 2012

<u>Present:</u> Councillors Shannon, Beane, Kirby, Mallen, Mr G Bambridge (District Councillor), Mrs H Moore (Clerk) and one parishioner.

Ongoing Issues from Previous Meetings

Possible Pedestrian Access to the Heath: Councillor Kirby met with James Winter of NCC Highways who suggested the Council peruse the possibility of matched funding through the Parish Partnership Scheme for a trod (basic footway construction) along Dereham Road and/or Billing ford Road as both remain feasible options. Councillor Kirby will pursue more detail from Highways, including further cost information, to enable the Council to consider both options fully.

<u>Folland Court</u>: The Land Registry application is complete and the Solicitor is now working to register the necessary restriction by which the Parish Council is not allowed to sell the land without Breckland District Council's approval. The rose arch is now in position and the roses are due to be planted on 12th November. All agreed to pay the final legal bill which has been received from the Solicitors.

<u>Possible Work on Churchyard Trees:</u> The Council still await a report from the tree surgeon.

<u>Condition of Common Lane</u>: Highways have agreed to programme the Rangers to carry out repair work on the lane, including excavation of a 2 metre drainage channel at the largest low lying area and the filling of holes at the other two problematic areas.

<u>Bus Service Requirements:</u> Comments have been received from parishioners confirming the need for a service to/from Dereham. Comments can still be forwarded to the Clerk or left on the clipboard in the shop on The Street. The Clerk will now press County Councillor Bill Borrett for his support to get a representative from NCC to attend a future PC meeting so that the issue can be properly discussed. District Councillor Gordon Bambridge suggested a logical solution would be to have an existing route extended to include Bawdeswell, Billingford, Lyng and Sparham.

Other Business of Interest to Parishioners

<u>Village Hall</u>: The Village Hall Committee is still pursuing funding for the new hall. Project Bawdeswell is now focusing on the creation of facilities and activities for young people.

It is good to report that exciting positive things are happening as far as the progress of the new Village Hall project is concerned. However, exceedingly worrying and negative actions have been occurring at the current hall:

On Remembrance Sunday, when most of the country was remembering the loss of those who gave their lives to ensure freedoms for later generations, another window at the Village Hall was smashed; a hole large enough for someone to walk through was created and the rear fire exit was opened and wedged to remain open. Around 20 stones were found inside the Hall. The Police and Crime Scene investigators have been looking for evidence, and it is hoped that finger prints, foot prints and blood will be found and an arrest made. Breaking and entering is a serious crime and will not be overlooked. We are going to increase our surveillance of the area and take any measures necessary to stop this vandalism and apprehend the perpetrators. If anyone witnessed any suspicious activity on Sunday 11th November please contact John Menzies on 01362 688 400.

And perpetrators - BE WARNED YOU WILL BE IDENTIFIED!

6th Positive - There's a job to be filled - A Caretaker is needed - it would be great if there were a handyman out there with a few hours a week to spare who could take on the role?? Does anyone feel that's for them or know anybody they could recommend?

7th Positive - The Family Christmas Party in the hall will go ahead on 16th December as last year. Father Christmas is coming and there will be presents for children. Please see details elsewhere in this magazine.

8th Positive - Project Bawdeswell has been incorporated into the VH Committee. Its aims as outlined in its Mission Statement – "to enhance the recreational and socials needs of our community" have been broken down into 4 categories affecting different groups of Bawdeswell villagers and become the stated Outcomes of the Lottery application. Youth, Seniors, and Young Families are each covered separately and Exercise and Fitness as an overall Outcome for the whole village. The lottery application has the title Project Bawdeswell. Fel Roberts is organising a separate group of concerned people to work specifically on the Youth Outcome. The VH Committee will continue to support activities for all groups but if there is someone who would like to take on one of the other Outcomes that would be great.

9th Positive – A Presentation meeting was held on 14th November at which the current position on the progress of the New Hall plans was given. It was well supported by villagers and our local District Councillor, Gordon Bambridge. Unfortunately the School Head Teacher had another appointment but he gave his apologies and reiterated the School's commitment to the Project and we were pleased to welcome Colin Brown, a long standing School Governor, representing him.

..... Many good things happening so let us not allow the pointless negative actions of a few (which will be addressed) destroy the ambitions of the majority!

BEATING THE SEASONAL BUG

Each winter, as unfortunate people succumb to seasonal 'bugs' and respiratory infections, Homeopaths are among those on the frontline, helping people who prefer an "alternative" approach.

Homeopathy is a system of medicine which is based on treating the individual with highly diluted substances given in mainly tablet form, which triggers the body's natural system of healing. Based on the individuals symptoms, a homeopath will match the most appropriate medicine to the patient. This system of medicine is suitable for all ages, including babies and the elderly, as it is non-toxic, and research has shown them to be effective in the treatment of people with flu, respiratory tract infections, otitis media (ear infection) and sinusitis.

Many parents are becoming increasingly concerned about giving children medications such as paracetamol (Calpol) and cough medicines, and are looking for an alternative approach. Recurrent coughs and infections should been seen by a professional Homeopath, but homeopathic remedies can be used at home in acute short-lived conditions.

There are many remedies available over the counter that could be useful in winter ailments, each having its own specific characteristics. Remedies commonly used in winter illnesses include:

Gelsemium: the number one "flu" remedy, with symptoms slow to come on. There is much heaviness and drooping, fatigue, clammy skin, flushes of hot and cold, dizziness and congestion.

Belladonna: symptoms have come on suddenly and there is heat, throbbing and pain, irritability, and symptoms worse from jarring. Children can be obstinate and may bite or hit.

Pulsatilla: has blocked painful sinuses, sticky mucus, feels better in the fresh air. Has a changeable, clingy, tearful mood.

Bryonia: symptoms are slow starting with much dryness and pains are worse from the slightest movement. Firm pressure on the affected area is helpful. They are irritable and want to be left alone. Children may reject what they just asked for.

Phosphorus: a hacking, tickling cough, often with sweating. The patient is worse at night and might ask for icy drinks or ice cream, which may be vomited up immediately. They may be hoarse, and are better for affection and massage, and worse for cold air. **Rhus tox:** slow onset with high temperature and great restlessness, constantly changing position, muscles stiff and painful. Any draft or cold air will aggrav ate. There is a feeling of heat inside, with cold skin and a desire to sip water.

Nux Vom: throat feels rough, extending into the ear, with tight hoarse feeling and heaviness in stomach with nausea and vomiting. Irritable and can't bear noises, light or odours.

St Thomas' Foxley

I am very pleased to say that we are about to embark on the next big project at the church. We are always trying to make the church presentable and attractive to the village. Last year we put in chancel heating and redecorated in time for last year's carol service. Now we have raised the funds for the next phase, thanks to generous donations, fund raising and a £6000 grant from the Norwich Diocesan Association of Bell Ringers. We can now start to renovate the bells and restore the bell chamber floor which was unsafe. Unfortunately we did not receive any money from the 'Your Heritage' lottery fund after two lengthy attempts- which was very disheartening. However, we are there now.

The work will begin in January and should be complete by early March next year. Not the best time to be doing things, but needs must. We had started a band over two years ago to learn how to ring from local volunteers across the Benefice. After 'borrowing' bell towers from other churches they will be able to ring the ones at Foxley. I am grateful to them for staying the course as picking up the skills has not been not easy. In addition many people have given up their time to tutor us, otherwise we would not have succeeded at all. You may have heard the chimed bell at each Foxley service over the last two years. From March we should be able to ring all six for services, weddings and special events, except for the early morning Communion service! We will however, need to practise our skills. These sessions will not be excessive, probably once or twice a week, with sound-proofing boards to be installed in the West and South louvred openings of the tower. I am sure that most people in the village will welcome the bells ringing out again after all these years of silence. After the bells are re-hung we hope to inaugurate a new stained glass window in the tower, celebrating the original three Foxley bells from 1708, made and donated by our local stained glass artist, Anne Cormie.

To further involve the community in the last school term, two members of the group have been teaching hand-bell ringing in conjunction with the local Bawdeswell primary school. It is very encouraging to see and hear the progress that has been made by the children, who are very talented.

I would like to thank all the people in the village that have either directly supported the bell fund or petitioned for their reinstatement. For the future, our next projects will be porch and nave redecoration, re-erection of the tower pinnacles and renovation of the chancel roof. The church has been there since 1100, and we are trying to do our bit for the next generation to enjoy. All volunteers who want to help are most welcome.

Dear Everybody, hello again.

Recently, big international corporations, such as Starbucks, Amazon and Google, have been exposed as paying tiny amounts of tax in this country compared to their sales revenue. Similarly, celebrities at the BBC, comedians and others have found ways of avoiding tax legally that means they pay a much smaller percentage than the average person.

What's this got to do with Christmas? At the centre of the Christmas story is the town of Bethlehem, where Joseph had to go to be enrolled for tax. He was, literally, an ordinary Joe. There were no special dispensations or exemptions for the family of Jesus. His family paid tax like any others.

Some people, it seems, are above paying tax. Most of us aren't. We express our solidarity with the rest of society in allowing some of our income to be used to pay for schools, roads, the health service; and maybe some things that we would also question. In our democracy, we can have a small say in how it is spent. In the time of Jesus, the occupying power had control over how money was spent – and a lot of it was used by them simply to stay in control.

Although tax is in the Christmas story, it isn't the Christmas story. That is the story of lots of different gifts – the gift of love and obedience by Mary, the gift of respect by Joseph, the gift of hospitality by the innkeeper, the gifts of the wise men.

But sometimes, if we aren't careful, any of us can turn the gifts we give at Christmastime into a kind of tax. We can feel burdened by our expectations to provide the right kind of gift, with the right amount of knowing what someone wants but hasn't bought themselves, and the right amount of money spent. It can feel as if we *have* to give, rather than choose to.

But if we don't have many material resources to give, don't worry. The gifts given to Jesus were the best ones: love, security, respect, understanding of who he was. Those you can always give.
