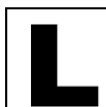

thrill onlookers. Thank you Karl for using your influence and getting them with us in the morning, it was great seeing and hearing them take off for their next charity gig.

After all the fun of that weekend and the final closing of the hall on 30th June, work has now started on the final de-commissioning, by the time this is published it will have been cleared and everything will be in storage.

The solicitors have now agreed on what they need to do to legalise the new building and the necessary document is being prepared, nothing can start until that is completed. All other requirements have been met. So we are gradually moving forward towards the goal.

At the meeting with the Parish Council on 7th July a presentation was given covering the good news on Lottery funding and local pledging, the breakdown of construction costs and programme, the building layout and the financial situation. Details can be seen on our website www.bawdeswellvillagehall.norfolkparishes.gov.uk. There was a lively Q and A session mostly about the driveway and car-park, which do not belong to the Charity. Grant funding may be available to improve the driveway and car park and it would be great if supporters could come forward and help the Parish Council in its quest to improve these facilities. MM

Book review –

The Elegance of the Hedgehog by Muriel Barbery

We are fortunate. Our book club is very democratic. We all suggest books that we think others might enjoy as well as hopefully provoking discussion. Sometimes we have to be patient and wait for sufficient copies to become available. Sometimes the wait is especially worth it. This one certainly was.

This suggested title came via a member's Maman-in-law. Written and published in French it had become a best seller, but at the time of the suggestion it had missed our radar, for a 'good read'. Most of us read the English translation but some kept to the original. All of us thought it worth turning the pages. I can only tell you a little of the story as I don't want to spoil it for you..... It's worth you reading it too!

The book follows a period in the lives of Renée Michel, a 54-year-old crotchety and dowdy concierge in a Parisian block of luxury apartments, and Paloma, a precocious 12-year-old girl who is the daughter of one of the most bourgeois families in the house. Paloma has decided that life is meaningless and is making plans to commit suicide on her 13th birthday. Both know that the world is absurd and each have different ways of dealing with their everyday lives. *"People aim for the stars, and they end up like goldfish in a bowl. I wonder if it wouldn't be simpler just to teach children right from the start that life is absurd."*

Both show a different face to the world than the one that is their inner self. It is the advent of a new cultured Japanese resident that brings changes to their lives. He recognises what they are both hiding from the world. He suggests to Paloma that the concierge has *'the same simple refinement as the hedgehog: a deceptively indolent little creature, fiercely solitary - and terribly elegant.'* Hence the title.

Yes, the book is philosophical and I did need to look up a few words, but it is very accessible. It is also humorous, informative and moving.

I suppose in a few words, it's a platonic love story.

BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL DIGEST OF MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 8th JULY 2014 AT 7.30pm IN THE VILLAGE HALL.

Present: Councillors: Shannon DS (Chair), Mason WM (Vice Chair), Beane CB, Cunliffe BC, Kirby AK, Lilwall JL, Mallen JM, Bambridge GB (District Councillor), Borrett BB (County Councillor), Mrs H Moore (Clerk) & 7 parishioners.

Ongoing issues from previous meetings:

Recreation Ground closure: The recreation ground is currently closed between 10pm and 7am, which has

been successful in stopping some of the car problem, albeit it has not completely stopped the anti social behaviour; in particular noise at night which is likely to get worse over the summer holidays. Volunteer numbers for the gate roster are also dropping too which is of concern. Anyone wishing to help with gate security should contact the Clerk, Helen Moore (01263 587954, helenmoore1974@yahoo.com). While some councillors supported the current opening hours, it was agreed to adjust the closure times from 10pm to 8am

with immediate effect, and to review the timings again in September with a view to restricting opening hours

further during the winter months. JL confirmed that some car parking would still be available for recreation ground users during the construction of the new hall, and that security of the building compound would be a contractor's responsibility. The contractor would be briefed to open the access gate in the morning and lock it again after work for each day ceased.

White lines on The Street: The Highways engineer had confirmed that the planned and agreed extra white lines on The Street, to facilitate the passage of the X29 bus through the village, would be painted by the 30th July.

Any other business of interest to Parishioners:

WWI Commemoration: JL informed the meeting that there would be a service to commemorate the commencement of WWI and the fallen in Bawdeswell Church on the 3rd August starting at 4pm. A choir of 23 people would support the service, during which the names and service details of the 15 fallen would be read, and a tea would be served afterwards. A display of research findings completed by Mr and Mrs Cunliffe would also be situated at the back of the church. On behalf of the PC, DS thanked the organisers and encouraged all to attend this service of commemoration.

Village Hall and Project Bawdeswell:

On behalf of the PC, DS thanked the VH Committee for its comprehensive review of the new hall project given at the joint meeting on 7th July. Despite emotions running

high, it had been a good meeting, and DS noted that the PC had continually supported the project and would continue to do so. JL, as VH Chairman, agreed that the project should be scrutinised and the meeting was a good opportunity to do that, particularly as there were still some issues which needed to be resolved by working together. Countering any possible lack of local support for the new hall, JL also noted that the project was in a sound position financially, with £70,000 being raised locally by fundraising activities and £33,000 offered in pledges from local people. The Big Lottery required a Deed of Dedication to be signed by the PC, prior to the building contract being let, to ensure that the new hall was not disposed of for the next 20 years. The PC agreed this in principle, ahead of the final document being received from Solicitors, and commissioned DS to sign the finalised deed on behalf of the PC. For Project Bawdeswell, AK noted that Karin Mason would be carrying out an English workshop again for children over the summer holidays. Support for the Youth Club was gently growing and it was hoped to continue its activities under alternative arrangements while the new hall is under construction.

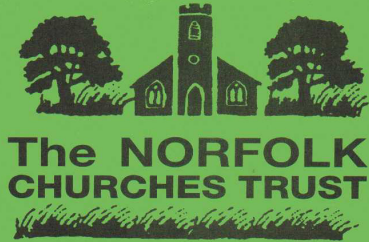

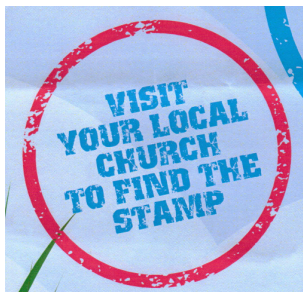

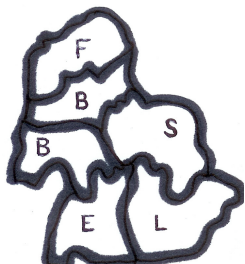
