Rural Open Sure Signal Scheme

"In the latest issue I noted the Parish Council decided not to apply for the Vodafone Rural Open Sure Signal. My partner and I are bewildered as we both have to stand at the bottom of our garden to get a signal (two bars if we are lucky!). At the front of our property we don't get any signal until we've left Hall Road. We're not running 'out of date' phones either so I'm sure it can't be put down to that.

We just wondered what phones or indeed service provider the Parish Council use (or the people that decided we don't need to apply for it and that we have an "adequate" signal) as we can't get a signal let alone 3G which is what Sure Signal is offering!"

"...Who decided that we have adequate coverage? And where do they live? Because most of the villagers I spoke to and myself couldn't believe what had been written.

The coverage is, at best, me leaning out of a bedroom window and hoping I get a signal, at worst no coverage at all. I live on Hall Road, so not down a dark and isolated area. Please can they re-think the application and at the very least send a survey out to the residents to actually find out the real stats of the case and not an assumption?"

"I was a little taken aback that you dismissed the Vodafone Sure Signal. I'm sure I'm not alone in having a poor signal in Bawdeswell. Is this going to cost us anything? And how many others feel, like me, that it should be reconsidered?"

Having received these letters, we contacted Bawdeswell Parish Council for a response:

The rationale of the Parish Council was that as the application process involved obtaining a survey of the village, finding a team to drive the project forward, the selection and approval of 5 – 10 suitable sites with a minimum 4mbps broadband speed that had the approval of the landowners concerned, coupled with the financial implications and limited timescale involved made the project difficult, particularly in the light of the super-fast broadband initiative coming to the village shortly. The fact that commercial sensitivities dictated that any improvements would not solve all the mobile phone signal problems in the village (in particular O2 which is virtually non-existent in the village) only helped to convince Councillors against the approach.

Residents who are experiencing problems with their mobile signal may wish to make enquiries from their provider about the possibility of obtaining/purchasing a signal booster for their own homes.

Remembrance Bells at Foxley

On Tuesday 11 November, the Foxley bells were rung 'half-muffled' after the 2 minute silence for 11 minutes. Quite a number of Foxley and Bawdeswell residents listened and watched the ringing. We felt this was a suitable tribute we could make as part of the Act of Remembrance. Ringing the bells at half-muffled gives a mournful tone to the striking. The effect is achieved by strapping a leather pad to the bell clanger, so one strike sounds normal, the other strike, as the clapper hits the bell face opposite, sounds completely different. Overall the effect is more sombre, as if the bell was ringing under water.

Book Club

Our last meeting covered two books as there had been insufficient copies for us to read the same one. This meant that we had to introduce the stories and describe how we'd felt about the plot and characters as well as talking about our general reading experience. You might know the stories, even if you haven't read the books, as they have both been adapted into other mediums.

The Turn of the Screw by Henry James



This is usually described as a gothic ghost story and was first published in 1898. But it is still a little too atmospheric for some especially for those, whose reading hour is nearer to midnight.

The story is a simple one. A governess is engaged by a disinterested guardian of two young, innocent and delightful children. However, and there is always a however in gothic novels isn't there? Supernatural and sinister events are on

the horizon and she begins to witness ghostly apparitions of a previous valet and governess. Neither, she believes, are up to any good. She thinks they want to attract, and thereby destroy the children.


Her job, she believes, even at personal risk, is to save the children. But there is another possibility. Could it be that she, the governess, is the one who is the threat to the children's wellbeing?


The book is quite a quick read, but its cleverness is in leaving the reader with more questions than answers. I'd suggest you try it...but perhaps leave the light on.

The Shooting Party by Isabel Colegate



The story follows a country house shooting party over the course of a weekend. It is set in 1913 and describes the rituals of the estate as well as the intricate relationships of the hosts and guests. The era is Edwardian and pre-war. Class rules. Life for the guests is indulgent. All whims are catered for by the 'lower orders'.







But things are a-changing. Some are beginning to question the order of things. Weekend events will precipitate life-changes.

I was surprised that the book was first published in 1980, as it felt to me that the author had personally lived through the era. This is early 'Downton'. Was it the inspiration for Julian Fellowes? Interestingly, in my copy, he provides the introduction to the book. I'd suggest it's one to read for the TV fans.

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the Library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading Saturday by Ian McEwan for discussion at our meeting on 4th December. We will also decide on books for next year and vote on our favourite 2014 read. We won't be meeting in January so our next meeting will be on the 5th February when we will read Americanah by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie. We read her previous novel Half of a Yellow Sun some time ago. New members are always welcome.
