





BAWDESWELL BOOK CLUB

Book Review - Jane and Prudence by Barbara Pym

Do you remember the early 1950s? If you do, this book, published in 1953, will remind you of the constraints of life then, or if you're of a younger 'vintage', this will book will give you a window into the life of a small parish in the post war years. I'm a relative newcomer to Bawdeswell, so can't judge if the life experienced by Jane and Prudence is one that older villagers here will recognise, but I'll bet it's not far off.



The story background is one of daily-helpers cum cooks queuing for liver or hearts for tea, inter-church rivalries, gossiping women, the importance of being acceptable and the importance of a 'sensible' marriage. I'd suggest that it's a 1950s version of Jane Austen. But then I'm a fan of both Austen and Pym. Her writing is clear, gentle, with, I think, her tongue in her cheek as she pokes fun at some of her characters and their lives. Chaps generally don't get much of a look in, and if they do, they don't feature as 'heroes'. Philip Larkin nominated her as the most underrated writer of the 20th century in 1977, so if you've not read any of her books before, I'd suggest they're worth a couple of hours of your time.

This book was kindly received by the book group, although some were antagonised by Jane's household incompetence.

So in an attempt not to spoil the story for anyone who might try this book, this is a short introduction.

Jane, previously a published writer is now middle-aged and a clergyman's wife, "really quite nice looking, with large eyes and short, rough, curly hair, but her clothes were terrible." Her younger friend Prudence is 29, "an age that is often rather desperate for a woman who has not married" with a string of "unsatisfactory love affairs". As this is Barbara Pym, there is no 'e' on the affairs, so we're given to imagine that they are more cerebral than physical. Her books are not for those seeking eroticism. Jane plans to find a man who might "do" for Prudence, and in case of doubt, in 1950 language, that meant finding a husband. It seems that married women, just as in Austen's time, found it obligatory to help others to enter the bliss of matrimony. Although on the evidence here, it would seem that Jane's marriage is more of a habit than it is blissful. Unsurprisingly, Jane's matchmaking is doomed to failure. Prudence will find her own way. CG.

MATTERS ARISING NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE ON AGENDA

Highways

The Clerk had contacted Highways before the meeting concerning Chapel Road West regarding the state of the verges and the road. The Old Natterjack was the main topic for this evening's meeting. The building site on Chapel Road West has become a mud bath, the verges are terrible, potholes are now appearing and, the ditch is blocked. It has now become a nuisance for all the residents living in this area and for those that use the walk through to cut over the A1067 to Foxley East. The Parishioners have complained that the builders are not cleaning up behind them at any time and they are also not very considerate to any deliveries being taken to Turnpike Close which is opposite the building site. It also hasn't helped that the site at Fairfield has now started which just so happens to be on the corner of Chapel Road West not helping with the conditions of the road. The Clerk has been asked to write to both developers and arrange a site meeting with both developers separately to discuss all the concerns from the Foxley residents, sending copies of letters to the planning officers at Breckland. Also the ditch is still blocked Highways did email the Clerk to inform her that they would be sending a contractor to flush the drains out and find where the problem is, apparently someone has been, but the problem hasn't been resolved. Clerk to contact Highways again also emailing County Councillor Bill Borrett.

Correspondence Local Government Policies

This was a lengthy discussion should Foxley keep the Boundary Settlements in place or do we have no Boundaries .This is a decision that all of Foxley should be involved in the deciding . If we keep the Boundaries as they are, Foxley could grow to be a big Village , but with no facilities (doctors, school, shop, public house). If we choose not to have any Boundaries then no more building will be allowed in Foxley, because we have no facilities Foxley would not be considered as a possible building area. This will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting in May and hopefully more Parishioners will attend this meeting to give their opinions. Public consultations will start in late spring at Breckland these are designed to enable individuals and groups to propose changes to or object to the proposed guidelines (envelope) of any town or village within Breckland.

Breckland ask any developers to make a contribution towards the village, have we missed the opportunity to benefit. Can we apply for some contribution towards something in the village.

Highways have now made a start on the Dereham Road footpath. Concerns raised by parishioners regarding the Billingford Road footpath have been passed on to Highways who have stated the surface will improve in the spring. AK will request the footpaths be rolled to level the surface more and that more bollards be positioned to prevent vehicles parking on the footpaths.

The Street - bus access & parking restrictions: Following on from correspondence with Highways and BB regarding restrictions on bus access to the village because of parking on The Street, DS met with the Highways Engineer. As a result of the meeting meeting, Highways have agreed to paint additional white lines restricting parking at the 'pinch' points. These white lines will run on both sides of The Street from the Village Sign up to the shop car park on one side, and up to and including the property 'Waratah' on the other. An additional white line will run from the corner of the Old Reepham Road (adjacent to the Workhouse Bar) up to and including the first church gate. There will also be additional 'H' bars outside of the first properties on each side of Old Reepham Road.

<u>Bus Services</u>: The Clerk received further confirmation from the Transport Department that the new Foulsham feeder service was not at the expense of any Bawdeswell service. However, in light of continuing concerns being voiced about the reduced X29 service through Bawdeswell, the Parish Council agreed that the Clerk should reply, copied to BB, stating the PC's concern about the reduced service, the lack of consultation prior to the cuts in service, and our continuing request for a bus service to Dereham. Parishioners' experiences and concerns regarding the bus service will be sought via the Reeves Tale.

The PC is continuing to fight on behalf of Parishioners to improve bus services. Your support would help and be much appreciated. Please let us know how you use the buses, how you would like the services to be improved and any experiences/issues you have encountered.

'Stopping up order' application on land opposite the garden centre: Notification has been received from Highways that the PC's concerns regarding the 'stopping up' application and possible sale of land opposite the garden centre have been forwarded to NCC's legal team who will be preparing the application for court.

Any other business of interest to Parishioners:

A planning application for two new dwellings with garages at 4 Saxon Meadows was approved by Breckland despite the PC's views. However, one condition of this decision notice states 'this permission is subject to a unilateral agreement requiring a financial contribution towards the provision of children's play and outdoor sports facilities which is payable upon commencement of the development hereby approved.' The Clerk has applied for this funding for play area equipment and this is now being processed by BDC. DS reported that, as requested by the PC, he had recently met with the new landowner of Two Fields Way field. It was a positive meeting with the landowner confirming he will be seeking to work with the village and the PC regarding any future plans for this land.

Village Hall and Project Bawdeswell

There is to be a visit from the Lottery team soon, with their decision on Stage 3 of the funding application due by 18th March. A further £10k funding has been achieved through the Geoffrey Watling Trust. DS had received some quotes for the work on the new hall car park and drive surfacing (£129k) and fencing (£10k). Issues regarding the environs of the new hall will need to be discussed between the VH Committee and the Parish Council once Stage 3 of the Lottery Bid has been declared successful. AK reported that the proposed Youth Club is still being pursued.

Finance

To agree the precept requirements for 2014/15, following on from discussions at the December meeting: GB reported BDC's confirmation that the parish grant has now been withdrawn. He was also of the opinion that the setting of any precept should bear in mind potential future capping of precept increases. All agreed to request a precept for 2014/15 of £17,500, as discussed at the December meeting.



While the country is being deluged our thermometer is rising! February has seen the



thermometer outside the village shop show a new total of £80,000. This sum is the total from fundraising, gifts, donations from the Parish Council over the years, and promised grants. On top of that we have also received pledges to help with cash flow during construction of the new hall. It all amounts to a creditable achievement by all concerned.

Two officers from the Big Lottery Fund came and met with us on 28th January. They had questions about our ambitions for new activities in the village, about the proposed building, costings, financing the surroundings, the local ecology, the demographics of the village, etc. So very wide ranging. We felt we were able to respond without too much difficulty and had lots of back-up information available. These officers plus one other, who has questioned us regarding the detail of the proposed building over the telephone, will write reports that go before a panel which will make the decision based on those reports; the panel won't see all our input. We now have to wait until the end of March to hear its conclusion. Fingers are well and truly crossed!

In the meantime the Village Hall is operating normally and is busy. Bookings are perfectly safe until the end of June. Alternative venues will be organised by us for regular hirers during the construction period and we will meet any extra costs incurred. Once we know the project can go forward we will be in touch with all hirers. Our next meeting will take place on Saturday 1st March at 10.00 am

in the Village Hall, it is an open meeting and all are welcome.

NORTH ELMHAM SURGERY PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP (PPG):

OUR ROLE AND SOME REASONS WHY YOU MIGHT LIKE TO JOIN US.

The purpose of the PPG is to assist in the development and implementation of "best practice" for the benefit of patients. It is not a forum for individuals to discuss their own or family's medical conditions.

Examples of issues the PPG has advised Surgery Staff on include: Improvements to telephone/receptionist and book/computing-website/pharmacy services/repeat prescriptions/waiting room layout/car parking and vehicle access from Holt road. The PPG is consulted by the Practice Manager on the format/content of the Annual Patient Survey form and is informed of the results of the survey. We were also consulted on the setting up and running of Breckland Home Care Service that currently employs 34 Care Assistants (2012-13).

The PPG is very concerned about how changes in government health policy are impacting on our patients. Surgery Staff update us on the effects on referral times (18 week rule compliance for various types of operation), ambulance response times, out of hours cover and patient choice for hospital treatment.

The PPG has also arranged a number of meetings with persons directly involved with the reorganisation of the NHS. These have included: The local MP, George Freeman, Oliver Cruikshank (South Norfolk Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG Liaison Officer). We have also consulted with Surgery Staff on their Integrated Care Program involving the secondment of a Social Worker dedicated to the Practice (2012-13). At our suggestion the surgery staff recently gave a presentation on Mental Health Diagnosis, Treatment and Support Services (Nov 2013).

Your PPG is seeking new members to help us maintain and improve upon the nationally recognised excellence of our Practice. Parents of young children are particularly welcome since they utilise a different range of services.

Our next meeting is at North Elmham VC School on Thursday March 13th at 19.30, when the guest speaker will be Dr Samantha Revill, Healthwatch Norfolk, who will give "An Overview of Our Work Program with Some Emphasis on Mental Health Services Including Those For Young People". This will be a public meeting with an opportunity for you to find out more about your PPG and hopefully encourage you to become a member. A very pretty server with a floral handle was left at the hall. Sandi Taylor has it at her house and can be contacted on 01362 688268.




