Multi Charity Christmas Card Shop

The Forum, Norwich, 14th October – 18th December

Cards for Good Causes sells charity cards across the UK each year. Shoppers can buy cards from nearly 40 charities, plus advent calendars, wrap and gifts from our volunteers who will staff the shop 7 days a week.

Cards for Good Causes Limited (CFGC) pays the participating charities (or their trading subsidiaries) at least 70p in every pound from their card sales, less the VAT payable on the amount retained by CFGC. The retained amount covers the CFGC's costs of running the temporary charity Christmas card shops. Cards for Good Causes Limited is the trading company of the 1959 Group of Charities (Registered Charity No. 249039).

Our retiring editor

After a period of eighteen years, Robin Taylor is retiring as Editor-in-Chief of The Reeve’s Tale. To have given such sterling service and with such notable success over such a long period of time is a remarkable achievement and one for which all of us in the villages of Bawdeswell and Foxley can be truly grateful.



When Robin took over the reins all those years ago, the magazine had been out of production for some time. Therefore from virtually nothing, he has made it into the professional publication to which we have now become accustomed. Indeed, according to the last village survey, The Reeve’s Tale was identified amongst the many respondents as the “information source of choice” for news and activities in the local area.

Born in Edinburgh of Scottish parents, Robin spent the first eight years of his life in India, where his father was an army eye surgeon. At the end of World War 2, there was much turmoil and rioting in India as the country demanded independence, and so he and his mother, amongst many expatriate women and children, were evacuated.

His father eventually followed them home, and secured a job as an eye surgeon in the hospital at Wisbech.

Robin went initially to boarding school at Hunstanton; later on he was sent to Glenalmond College in Perthshire, a public school which had, and still has, a peerless reputation for providing boys (and girls nowadays) with a good, formal, traditional, Scottish education.

After service in the Royal Air Force, which he spent mostly in Germany, Robin joined the BBC as a trainee engineer. His first posting was to Alexandra Palace, the birthplace of television; he then moved to the Television Centre where he came into contact with stars who are now household names. He participated in many historic broadcasts such as the first moon landing and the first satellite transmission. In 1976, Robin took a job in Norwich as an engineer at BBC East. It was at this time that he, with his wife Sandi and their three young children, came to live in Bawdeswell.

Sandi and friends started the pre-school playgroup in the former village hall, which was located in The Street where Old Woods Green now is. The playgroup later moved to the school site.

The day after they arrived in Bawdeswell, both Robin and Sandi were co-opted on to the Parochial Church Council.

Robin has been a churchwarden for longer than he cares to remember, and it was in this role that he volunteered to take on *The Reeve's Tale*. Originally a monthly church journal, he developed it over the years into a village magazine. This is how it remains today, a magazine for everyone.

The continuing success of *The Reeve's Tale* is due, in very large measure, to Robin's own personal qualities and talents. Robin's friendly, helpful and courteous manner has endeared him to us all, and his knowledge and range of skills have enabled him to undertake any of the tasks necessary for the satisfactory and timely delivery of the magazine every month.

Editorship and production of *The Reeve's Tale* now pass to Gavin and Emma Raines, who have lived in Bawdeswell for nearly four years. Gavin and Emma run a professional marketing and website company called Example Marketing, based right here in Bawdeswell. We are most fortunate that responsibility for the publication has transferred into such capable hands.

Robin meanwhile is not bowing out completely! He has agreed to be available to smooth the transition to Gavin and Emma. He has also agreed to retain supervision of the magazine's distribution. Although he is now taking a well-earned back seat, he is looking forward to seeing how the magazine, and – particularly as a communications engineer – the website, both develop.

This is clearly the end of an era, but one of which Robin can be justly proud.

Bawdeswell Village Hall: Letter from the Chairman



The tendering process for the contract to build our new hall, as you would expect, was strictly governed by our appointed architects and the Big Lottery. The short list was drawn up and approved by them and the management committee and I only had final sign off once the tenders had been received.

Certain criteria had to be met to make the short list and this excluded a large number of small and medium sized firms. We were pleased to announce that Omnis of Norwich was appointed contractor. Omnis is a local company and has worked on a number of major building projects in the region for a number of well-known clients. The investment being made by the Lottery, District and Parish Councils and others will, in effect, be returned to the local/regional economy through Omnis, their sub-contractors and suppliers. Please be assured Omnis is an excellent contractor with a proven ability to deliver a project of this size and complexity.

We have also been approached by a number of individuals and groups regarding the possibility of buying various bits and pieces from the old hall before and during the demolition. This unfortunately just isn't possible for a number of reasons including health and safety, contractor interruptions, Charity Commission best practice and the price quoted to carry out this phase of the project. I'm sure all will understand the restraint we, as a team, are under.

The Lottery is making a large investment in our community and their charge on the building runs for 20 years. In effect we cannot do anything to change the usage of the building without reference to them in that time. The repayment is not financial but is represented by community activities that improve the lives of all residents.

The team and I are now heavily focused on the commissioning and launch of the new facilities and achieving the Lottery's desired outcomes that we are committed to. We really need to strengthen the management team with some fresh, new ideas to enable it to maximise the return on this new fantastic facility. Can you help? Are you interested or have experience with certain groups, activities and ages? We would like to hear about them and input would be really valuable to help us shape the outcomes. Do get in touch with any of us; your ideas and help would be most welcome. There is a need now for others to become involved and enjoy this once in a lifetime opportunity to launch and create a great centre for the village!

Village Hall Committee Update

The Committee has been very busy throughout the summer as there was plenty to do and organise. There have been frustrating delays in getting started on the new building. A group of volunteers quickly packed up and emptied the old building in July and we are grateful to all who took part. The Portakabin was cleared out and sold and removed from site at the end of July. The legal requirements took more time than had been allowed but the Lottery finally signed at the beginning of August. We applied to Natural England to update The European Protected Species Licence which we understood would not take long as only one line needed altering, how wrong we were! On the 28th July they acknowledged our application received on the 24th saying that at busy times it could take up to 30 working days, i.e 4th September, and it did! So the longest delay was caused by a Government agency.

Luckily our local Council has been very understanding and helpful: at the end of June we applied to Breckland for a Match Funding Grant towards stage 3 of the project “construction” and heard early in August that we had been successful and were granted £5,000 for which we are most grateful. In 2011 Breckland had awarded a Match Funding Grant of £7,936 towards stage 1 Architects’ Plans and have been very supportive with advice and encouragement since that time.

The old building was demolished in the week beginning 8th September after Ecologists had spent from 4am carrying out a further Bat Survey. One of them then went up in a cherry picker while the operative pulled up bits of the roof for her to search under. His “grabber” machine was used to pull back roofing sheets very carefully and up they went again in the cherry picker, this process happened 4 or 5 times until the Ecologist was confident there were no bats to remove to the boxes placed in readiness on nearby trees. This is going to be a large expense for the project but one we have to face as “Meeting the Requirements of Natural England” was a planning condition. From the 15th the contractors, Omnis, a local Norwich firm, will be on site and the new hall is scheduled to be completed during April 2015.




Book Club



The speaker at our September meeting was Victoria Draper from the Norfolk Records Office who gave us an insight into the workings of the Archive Centre near County Hall in Norwich. It holds unique records and is free for anyone to access, with expert staff to guide your research. The Archive Centre holds 12.5 million records with the oldest, dating from 1090, being a charter from William II granting hunting rights. Victoria had also brought interesting slides relating to the history of Sparham: original 1852 plans for the school, a page from the 1901 census, a page of the parish register from 1573-1692 and a probate inventory of 1703. One slide showed papers relating to those emigrating to America and from June 1835-36. There were 5,241 emigrants from the UK of which 3068 were from Norfolk. We were all fascinated by this brief look into our history and as a WI we will definitely go and take a tour of the Archive Centre in the future.




