

Ten-year-old Abdullah and his beloved three-year-old sister Pari ("fairy" in Farsi) live with their father, stepmother and baby halfbrother in the small village of Shadbagh. Their father, Saboor, takes manual work where he can find it and the family gets by living hand-to-mouth. In the autumn of 1952, with another infant on the way and a brutal winter in prospect, Saboor is



desperate enough to arrive at a terrible decision. He must make a sacrifice to save the family. So it is, that one day Abdullah and Pari find themselves walking with their father across the desert to Kabul.

Only when they reach the house of a wealthy childless couple, where Uncle Nabi is employed as cook and chauffeur, does Abdullah realise with horror that he's to lose the person most precious to him. Pari is to be adopted by Mr and Mrs Wahdati and he must never see her again.

The author's focus rests perhaps not so much in repairing Saboor's action as in exploring the consequences of it and this involves us in a whole network of new characters and narratives that weave back and forth in time and place. While one is aware of the troubles of subsequent eras acting out in the background, this is not a novel about Afghan politics, this story is more human and personal.

Part of Hosseini's effectiveness as a storyteller is the way he draws on universal signifiers of myth and symbol. The author uses archetypes: the wicked stepmother, the master and the servant, the brothers (in this case, cousins) who are friends yet rivals, but his skill is to put flesh on them, to make them real and individual. Though Pari quickly forgets her birth family, she's haunted by snatches of an old folk song her brother used to sing. The final implied question to the reader perhaps: is it better to remember, even though this means a life of pain?

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the Library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "And the Mountains Echoed" by Khaled Hosseini for discussion at our meeting on the 5th March and will read "Black Sheep" by Susan Hill for discussion at our meeting on the 2nd April. Chicken Cottage Childcare

This month, we popped along to meet Carol Taylor and the team at Chicken Cottage Childcare in Bawdeswell.

A busy start to the year for you?

"Yes! I've been working in childcare for years and I used to run Bawdeswell's pre-school. When it closed down at the end of last year, lots of parents were looking for somewhere new to take their children. I thought I'd grab



the opportunity and extend the child-minding I was already offering. So, with a new dedicated 'cottage', and helped by Natalie Harrison and Jayne Hough (who also worked at the pre-school), Chicken Cottage Childcare grew very quickly!"

How many children do you take care of?

"We currently have 19 registered, but we don't look after them all at once! We look after children from babies to pre-school age (around 5). We have a ratio of 1:3 staff to children which is lower than a pre-school, so we're able to offer all the children the care they deserve."

What sort of things do you do with the children?

"We have a big emphasis on getting outside. We try to head out every day, either into the garden here where we feed the chickens or plant seeds, or into the village to feed the ducks. We follow the early years' curriculum and this term we're looking at spring – we've been growing cress and we'll be making wind socks and a weather station. We're currently fundraising for a fish tank which the children will love."

What's the best bit about what you do?

"It's so rewarding. When a parent says "that's the first time they've wanted to go to a child minder" we feel proud. With children, you get so much more back than you put in. When the children are happy, the parents are happy, and we're happy too!"

Parish Councils

Bawdeswell Parish Council

Meeting of Bawdeswell Parish Council held on Monday 2nd March 2015 at the church.

Present: W Mason (Chair), J Mallen, B Cunliffe and C. Beane. Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk) Members of the public: 1.

Although one quote has already been received, the Council are still seeking two additional quotes to install a kissing gate at the Saxon Meadow entrance of the recreation ground. The Council are also seeking quotes for play area and general village maintenance. If you are interested in providing a quote, please contact the Clerk for further information.

On April 2nd at 10am, the Magistrates court in Kings Lynn will consider the stopping up order application to part of the highway verge to the east of the B1145 Norwich Road. The Parish Council have requested that their views be represented at the hearing. Whilst the PC accepts that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes, they are concerned about the subsequent disposal of the land to a private individual. Norfolk County Council confirms that it remains their view that the area of highway is unnecessary and they accept the stopping up application. The Parish Council have forwarded their concerns to County Cllr Bill Borrett in the hope he will ensure that their views are represented and considered.

The PC proposes to install a litter bin at Adams Pit. Breckland has just approved the proposal so it is hoped that the new bin will be ordered and in place shortly.

Unfortunately, Breckland only received a handful of comments from residents on the introduction of numbering for The Street, Bawdeswell. As a result they are unable to go ahead with the numbering programme due to lack of interest.

Dereham Road Trod - Cllr Shannon canvassed the views of the Parish Council and the residents of Dereham Road who live within the parish. All were in favour of seeking a refund of the monies provided by the parish towards the Dereham Road Trod. This was on the understanding that Highways will continue its function of clearing the waste pipes and natural grips and cutting the verges on a regular basis, and will install other grips/waste pipes to cure the rain pooling problem on the road side opposite Heath Cottage. Once received, the monies will be refunded to those residents who donated towards the scheme.




