

Kathleen Audrey Amiss

16th March 1915 to 21st October 2015

Born in Guestwick, we said Farewell to Kathleen in Swanton Morley Church on the 11th November – a poignant date because of her birth in the First World War – 100 years ago, she was the eldest of ten children of whom five survive her.

Leaving School at 14 Kathleen Hudson entered Service in three different houses before she met Reggie Amiss and was married in 1936 at Swanton Morley Church. Before moving into The Orchard Cottage in Reepham Road in Bawdeswell, where she lived for almost 80 years until two years ago. She had two children, four Grandchildren, ten Great Grandchildren, and five Great Grandchildren with more expected! A huge dynasty.

She became Cook for 25 years at Bawdeswell School. I have yet to hear any complaints about her! She developed a great skill in producing Christmas, Easter, and Wedding Cakes. She also cooked for Bernard Matthews, for four generations of Gurneys at Bawdeswell Hall and accompanied that Family to Scotland on many occasions on their fishing holidays where she became firm friends with so many of their guests, including Peter Nott, Bishop of Norwich. 'Her Bishop' as she called him, who called to see Kathleen only four weeks ago.

In her youth she used to attend many Whist Drives in the Village and was an active Member of the Community as a whole.

Her epitaph: 'small in stature with a big heart – she was friend to all'.

Hazel Loose

Many of you will have known Hazel Loose, who lived for many years at The Thatched Cottage, Bawdeswell Hall, and has sadly died in October. She was born in 1921 and was brought up in Sedgeford, as the eldest daughter of Edward and Charlotte Jane Critcher. After school and working for a while in Surrey, she lied about her age and joined the ATS when it was formed in 1938. She always liked the Military (and men in uniform) and she married her husband Ray Loose in 1941 and subsequently transferred to the WRENS (Ray was in the Royal Navy throughout the War).

In 1956 Hazel and Ray started working for Mr and Mrs Richard Gurney initially at Keswick near Norwich. In 1969 they moved with Mr and Mrs Gurney to Bawdeswell Hall living initially in a wing of the Hall and then in The Thatched Cottage. She continued to live there alone after Ray's death in 2002 until four years ago when, at the age of 90, she went to live with her daughters.

Earlier this year she moved into Hill Barn Care Home in Sparham where she died peacefully a few days after her 94th Birthday.

She was a Founder Member of the Triangle Club (Bawdeswell, Billingford and Foxley) which was a successor to the WI.

Hazel was friendly, kind, generous, vivacious – a truly lovely lady – and she will be greatly missed by her Family and her many friends.

Book Club

"We Are All Completely Beside Ourselves" by Karen Joy Fowler



I first read this book in April 2015, when I found it didn't live up to my expectations. Returning to this book for the Book Club, it transpires that in the height of my previous blinding emotion, much of the goodness of the book had been lost to me.



So now six months later, I think it is actually really very good and I would definitely recommend it. Its main theme is about loss. At the age of five the protagonist loses her sister. She is unable to articulate her feelings and is not listened to, or even allowed to talk about it. I am not a believer that children are resilient. The trauma always comes out in the end, one way or another. It did here.

It is a credit to Karen Joy Fowler that the reader grasps the pain and grief suffered by the family. When I first read it, the title gave me no clues, but now I see that as well is ostensibly about grief and its effect on all the immediate family. They all go to their own different extremes to cope with the major loss of a family member and are not united by the common grief.

Karen Joy Fowler's background of being raised by psychologists meant she didn't "have to make that part up at all", but she had to do a lot of research to cover the, not insignificant, issues raised by the book. Her background and research have resulted in a very interesting read on subjects that affect all of us.

The members of the Book Club were in total agreement that it definitely didn't deliver on the humorous label it had been given. In fact it was agreed that it is a very sad story about a badly conceived idea going wrong, and the lasting negative effect of it on all those involved.

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "Chapman's Odyssey" by Paul Bailey for discussion at our meeting on the 3rd December and will read "The Luminaries" by Eleanor Catton for discussion at our meeting on the 7th January 2016. 

Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting 2nd November 2015

Present: D. Shannon (Chair), J. Mallen, R. Reed, B. Cunliffe and T. Smith Mrs. J. Boxall (Clerk).

Members of the public: 1

At the previous meeting, the PC agreed in principle to assisting with the repair of the church clock as it was deemed to be of community benefit. Recycling credits of £897.41 were confirmed as being available for community projects.

The Council **Resolved to approve** allocating the recycling credit monies for 2015/16 up to £879.41 to the repair of the Church Clock on the understanding that the Parochial Church Council obtain competitive quotes.

The Council received an update on future projects with regards to nominating a scheme to register for open space and play space provision and improvement. Following an initial meeting a few minor projects are in hand for the Village Hall environs and recreation ground including a BBQ area, fencing and play equipment.

Breckland District Council as the Local Planning Authority, will be going out to consultation on possible areas of land for development in Bawdeswell in a few weeks, although the date is still uncertain and will depend upon the decision of elected members. It is understood that areas have been put forward in Bawdeswell, although it is not expected that specific areas will be highlighted at this stage.

The Parish Council recognise that residents would welcome the opportunity to see and understand the proposals and therefore when the consultation dates are confirmed, the PC will be asking Breckland to organise an 'event' (hopefully in the Village Hall) at which they will present their proposals and will be available to answer any questions.

Bawdeswell Parish Council have already approved a general policy and approach to Possible Village Development in any Future Breckland Local Development Framework and a copy of this is available to view on the PC website.

The next PC meeting will be held on Monday 7th December 2015 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. There is not usually a meeting in January.

The PC will be discussing and considering the precept request for 2016/17. A Parish Council gets its funding by receiving an amount of the local Council Tax which is known as the precept. The Parish Council need to consider how much money they

Letter from Lyn

At the beginning of December we enter the season of Advent. Advent is a time of reflection and waiting. It is traditional to mark this time with an Advent calendar. Today these calendars are often filled with treats, each day you open a new window and the treat is revealed.



In some churches the season of Advent is also marked with an Advent wreath. At Christmas, wreaths can be found in both the parish church and in the home. The Advent wreath is a more recent tradition than the calendar, it began to be used widely in the 1930s. It is often circular, representing God's eternity, and it can include four candles. Each of the four candles are lit on successive Sundays of Advent.

It is a bit like a countdown to the big event. The Advent calendar giving a treat, a glimpse of the goodies in store while the Advent wreath acts as a reminder of God's eternal nature and the light he brings into each of our lives. As the candles are lit, first one, then two, then three and then four. The intensity of the light increases as the time of Jesus' birth draws near.

We often live in anticipation of something good, it may be a time when we can retire and do those things we dream of. Or it could be a holiday to a favourite place with the people we love. Whatever it may be for you personally, even if the reality does not match the dream, the hope is worthwhile.

How much more is it worthwhile, when we can hope for the light and love which God brings to us in Jesus. I pray that God will grant you many Blessings this Christmas.

New Team Ministry

We recently attended a Conference at the Frost Hall in Foulsham to discuss a reorganisation of the Sparham Deanery.

From early next year our present Benefice, comprising Foxley, Lyng, Elsing, Bawdeswell, Bylaugh and Sparham, will become part of a new Team Benefice which will include the Reepham group of churches and some of the Wensum group churches.

The present vicar of Reepham will become Team Rector and our Lyn Page will become the Team Vicar but with continuing pastoral responsibility for Foxley, Lyng, Elsing, Bawdeswell, Bylaugh and Sparham. This reorganisation is to cut down on the overall number of clergy and is a process being carried out across the Diocese. We can expect some sharing of talents across the new grouping and the opportunity to meet new people in our worship and subsequent social gatherings. The news is positive really.

Parish Share Support

A second meeting we attended was at Diocesan House to explain our financial situation and to ask for a reduction in our Parish Share for 2016. This will be considered along with all the pleas by other churches and we will get an answer sometime soon we hope.

As a church with less than 20 people on its Electoral Roll, it is hard to pay the Diocese in the region of £15,000 a year to have a priest in our parish and pay our share of training new priests in the region etc. Next year the sum being asked is scheduled to go up by £2,250. The maintenance of the building is paid for by the generosity and support of The Friends of Bawdeswell Church who run fundraising events throughout the year, as you know. This takes a huge burden off our shoulders.

The cost of having a priest to conduct our worship, baptisms, weddings, funerals and our share of other expenses is met by a very small number of individuals who make regular monthly payments, and some who put money in the collection plate whenever they attend church.

£1 a week from every household in the village would more than cover the cost, but it is not reasonable to ask everyone to do this. If just an extra 44 of the 800 people in Bawdeswell would do so, then that would help us to meet next year's commitment,

and help to maintain baptisms, weddings, funerals etc. for another year in what is Bawdeswell's Village Church.
