#### **Bawdeswell Village Hall**

The Trustees are continuing to meet twice a month and putting in many hours of admin work, site visits, phone calls, etc. between



meetings. It is all worth it - the finished building will be great! It will be available for use just about the time this June magazine hits the streets! This has been a large undertaking by the Village Hall Trustees for the use of all villagers and we sincerely trust that you will all use it and enjoy it for many years to come.

£75,000 has been raised locally for the project, and our thanks go to all those who have helped and donated. In all, an extra £4,000 has been donated for the white goods in the kitchen and a recent special birthday party raised another £1,000 towards the fit out of the building. We have benefitted from, and are grateful for a grant, from the Parish Council of £50,000. We were able to proceed only because the Parish Council agreed in 2013 to underwrite a further £70,000 in case of need, but we are pleased to say that none of this extra funding was required thanks to tight cost control, external grants obtained and, most importantly, continuing donations. The running of the new hall will be met without reliance on funds from the PC.

The building will be fully paid for and handed over to us once the final figures from the builder are agreed. We are expecting a visit from the Lottery in June to confirm that we have completed the building to their satisfaction. They have been kept in touch with progress with many reports each month and via David Cockburn's excellent blog and are very impressed with what they have seen and how well the finances have been controlled. We take heart from their comments as they are dealing with buildings like ours all over the country.

So a positive outcome all round! Due largely to the band of donors and volunteers who have given so generously of their time, talents and money! A big thank you to vou all.

Plans are well in hand for the celebratory weekend of the 25/26 July, which a separate group is working hard on at the moment; please check the website (bawdeswellvillagehall.co.uk) for more details. We look forward to seeing you all that weekend and having a great big Bawdeswell party.

#### **Book Club** Testament of Mary by Colm Toibin



For the second month running our listed book has been a novella. And for the second time running I have been astounded by the depth that can be achieved within 100 pages. No padding. No superfluous words. Just purely written art!

It is possible though, that this book might offend some readers. It certainly upset relationships in our household. A devout daughter-in-law branded it as heretical when it was sent as a well meant present and was unable to bring herself to even discuss its composition. But I believe it is a book to be read for the form of its prose as for the story itself. This is an imagined account, based on a famous story. Only a few names are mentioned but I think it is highly likely that every reader will know the background.

It's a quick read but immediately captures deep anguish and desperation. Mary's fear is apparent as she remembers the events following her son's boyhood. She tried to warn him against his beliefs. She wanted to keep him safe. But he wouldn't listen. Any chance of distracting him from his own ideas was not going to work.

Of course, you know the story, I don't need to say more, except this time we are hearing the story from a different person. One, who in different belief systems is given quite a minor role. This time though, she is centre stage. I can only measure my feelings surrounding this writing by saying that I totally believed in her distress, her anger and resentment. I felt that I was there. I was worried for her and about her. It made me think of other mothers who in today's world might be worried about their sons' fanatical beliefs or maybe are frightened at the prospect of being recognised as a result of their actions. Yes, I'm thinking about the mother of a pilot, a mother of a jihadist. What pain they must feel.

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the Library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "The Enchanted April" by Elizabeth von Amin for discussion at our meeting on the 4th June and will read "Miss Pettigrew lives for a day" for discussion at our meeting on the 2nd July. 
#### GIG: God Is Good

#### **Letter from Lyn**

This month has been a busy time at the rectory with lots of preparation for summer weddings and baptisms. We took advantage of one glorious Saturday afternoon to visit the famed bluebell woods in Foxley. I must confess that we passed by the visitors notice board without stopping to read it. Peter, my husband, is a keen photographer and was keen to take a few pictures of the bluebell carpets. As we walked down the path from the car, there were only a few bluebells to be seen. We saw other wildflowers including some lovely



orchids, but sadly only a few bluebells dotted about here and there. Having walked quite a distance we came to what looked like the end of the main path.

We were both quite disappointed at this, the path continued into the woods with no clear indication of which was the best way to go. So not to be deterred we continued noticing that quite a few people had not gone any further than this. Then quite unexpectedly, we could see there were a few more bluebells and then more and more, and then thousands of them! It was well worth the walk and not too busy.

We thoroughly enjoyed the visit even though Peter did not actually get any photographs. He had managed to leave his camera's memory card back home in the computer! Lesson learned, he now travels with a spare card attached to the camera strap.

Often life can be similar to that walk we took in Foxley Wood on Saturday. Life is full of surprises and new challenges. We can be discouraged by not finding what we expect along our way and then unexpectedly, in the most unlikely places, we find things that far exceed our imagination. That is what happened to the disciples on the road to Emmaus. A stranger joined them as they walked along talking about how Jesus had died. When they stopped for the night and sat down to eat, they realised that the stranger was Jesus. That was not what they had expected or even dared to hope for, Jesus alive amongst them again.

In our own lives, the same sort of wonderful thing can happen. Sometimes, like the disciples walking from Jerusalem to Emmaus, we do not even recognise what is happening until it's nearly too late. I always try to expect the unexpected, but find it impossible not to be amazed and stunned by the wonderful things God does around us, often almost unnoticed.

#### St Thomas' Church, Foxley

Our Annual Vestry and Parochial Church Meetings were held in church on 14th April. The Vestry Meeting re-elected John Harvey and Tony Rushbrook as churchwardens. It was with great sorrow that we received the news from Tony that he and Christine, who have contributed so greatly to the life of the church and village, will be leaving us for pastures new. Therefore, the length of time he will be able to carry on his duties as warden is likely to be for a limited period, he explained.

At the APCM, reports were circulated and duly approved. Essentially, the Rev'd Lynn, who chaired the evening, had prepared a report which covered all her six parishes as our Priest-in-Charge. She expressed her joy and privilege at being amongst us and made a resume of her work in the churches and schools of the parishes. She gave thanks to all who have helped during the year. She touched on the challenges ahead and ended: "It is the Holy Spirit that continually leads us on to the new, through sharing the Gospel and prayer. The ministry of the church and all that we hope to be does sometimes seem difficult to achieve. With Christ at our centre I believe nothing is impossible. We can achieve amazing things together through prayer and patience." John Harvey thanked her and wished her well for her future ministry here.
