The Theory of Everything



The Theory of Everything is the story of the most brilliant and celebrated physicist of our time, Stephen Hawking (Eddie Redmayne who won Oscar for best Actor), and Jane Wilde (Felicity Jones) the arts student he fell in love with whilst studying at Cambridge in the 1960s. Little was expected from Stephen Hawking, a bright but shiftless student of cosmology, given just two years to live following the diagnosis of a fatal illness at 21 years of age. He became galvanized, however, by the love of fellow Cambridge student, Jane Wilde, and he went on to be called the successor to Einstein, as well as a husband and father to their three children. Over the course of their marriage as Stephen's body collapsed and his academic renown soared, fault lines were exposed that tested the lineaments of their relationship and dramatically altered the course of both of their lives.

Our exciting new website is up and running now – visit www.bawdeswellvillagehall.co.uk. Information will be added to it as future activities are organised. Plans for the launch weekend will also be on the website.

When it comes to new activities we are particularly focussing on our stated Lottery Outcomes for youth, seniors, families and more exercise for all. The start-up of activities for these groups will be subsidised if possible until they are established. There are lots of opportunities now for anyone wanting to start new activities or to book functions at the hall from July onwards. There are plans in hand for the children during the school holidays and the established activities of table tennis, cards, craft, FAB etc. will all move into the new building as soon as possible.

Internal work on the new building is progressing well with sub-contractors from different trades working in various parts of the building at the same time. The patio area around the building is also being laid at the moment.

We have identified the chair to be ordered, which was the most popular of four tested by many villagers.

We're enormously grateful to all the people who've donated white goods for the kitchen; it will be fully equipped when the building opens. We are grateful too to all those who have supported, donated and raised funds for this project over the years.

Our AGM is to be held at 7.30 pm on Monday 22nd June 2015 in the Village Hall!!! We look forward to seeing you there.

Book Club
Black Sheep by Susan Hill



This is a sad and depressing tale, but beautifully written. The pleasure for the reader is in the clear and sparse writing. It is the shortest book we have ever read at just over 100 pages but much is learnt of the characters and their environment without a lot of words: great writing.

The setting is a small pit town, it has a Dante's Inferno feel, the pit is at the bottom and the homes of the workers are terraced up the hill from it, at the top there are open spaces, farms and white sheep in an area covered in thick white snow for a great deal of time, so black at the bottom and white at the top. But the pit families don't venture up the hill.

There are deeply sad events throughout the story but one of the saddest things is the seeming acceptance by the miners and their families of their position in the world; they see themselves as mining families, nothing else. There is humanity amongst the women and two of the sons. The youngest son has a wonderful unspoken bond with his dying grandmother. But mostly the mature characters have tried to isolate and protect themselves from emotion. It is those two sons and the only daughter who feel there is more to existence. Two of them seek to widen their horizons but don't succeed in escaping even in a small way and are pulled back by unforeseen events and the social mores of the society. The third leaves without telling any member of his family and he is never heard of again.

These families never discussed anything; but they judged in black and white terms. They had to harden themselves to loss because death or maiming was common for generations of men working in dangerous conditions below ground. It is hard for us to understand or accept such attitudes in our world of encouraged freedoms.

One of our members wasn't able to be at the meeting but sent a humorous response which lightened the mood and it was felt it should be enjoyed by others:

Quote "I wonder what sadistic individual chose to inflict this thankfully mini saga of unrelenting drudgery, doom and gloom on us poor folk hoping to cheerfully while away an evening while waiting for Spring to come. It makes Greek tragedy seem positively light-hearted. "Titus Andronicus" a comedy: more deaths than Midsomer

Murders (but without the fun) meant that it could only be a slim volume as there would have had to be a family cast of hundreds to continue with the death rate.

I am amazed that the book was published. Rose was left alive (to suffer further, I suppose) so perhaps there is to be a sequel. "The Death of Rose" like some mining village "Duchess of Malfi" showing her drawn out existence of further drudgery and the subsequent slow and agonising death of her and all she touched. Words almost fail me (but never quite, of course). Well that's got that off my chest not a read for the depressed. Roll on the comedy." Unquote

All members appreciated the laughter evoked by this response. The majority were pleased to have read the novel inspite of the desperate sadness of the story, and thankful to be living in another age.

Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting 13th April 2015

Grant Award

The Parish Council were successful in obtaining £1,000 grant funding from Breckland to progress the recreation area project. This project seeks to engender community spirit within and between the three communities of Bawdeswell, Bylaugh and Foxley by providing a safe and comfortable al fresco meeting and entertainment area suitable for all age groups and interests.

The area will provide a natural extension to the facilities provided within the new village hall, while acting as a metaphoric bridge between the various children's play areas and the village hall, so providing a safe passage for children and improved parental monitoring.

Thank you to all who supported this funding bid!

Stopping Up Order – Land opposite Bawdeswell Garden Centre

The Parish Council expressed concern over the recently awarded Stopping Up Order and disposal of land. It was the PC's initial hope that the land, no longer required by Highways, would be donated to the Parish Council but in light of Norfolk County Council's land disposal policy, this was not a realistic ambition. The PC expressed their frustration at legal officials, who failed to supply information to them in a timely fashion, despite numerous requests. The PC wished to ensure that NCC officials dispose of the land openly and obtain the best price through competitive tender. County Cllr Bill Borrett confirmed that the District Valuer had assessed the value of the land. The council requested that County Cllr Borrett ascertain if this valuation was obtained before or after the Stopping Up Order was awarded (as this would affect the value). County Cllr Borrett promised to take the Council's concerns back to NCC and report back.

Tree Survey

The PC commissioned a tree survey on trees in the churchyard, Adams Pit and on the recreation ground. The report has not highlighted any trees needing immediate attention and any recommendations will be carried out as part of the general village maintenance.

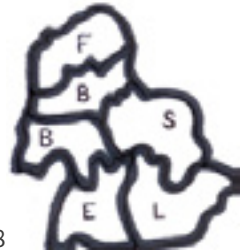
