A great deal has happened in the two months since the last Reeve's Tale. Of course the biggest event was the weekend opening celebrations, which is covered separately in this magazine.



Opening and running a café during the afternoons of the school holidays proved very popular with users of the field. We are grateful to all those who volunteered to man the café bar and to those who donated drinks and sweets. A big thank you goes to John Mallen and Roger Fryatt who were the main instigators of this successful service for the community, which also provided the opportunity for lots of people to see the building and its facilities. From October onwards it is planned to run a café/coffee morning each week; there's more about that somewhere in this magazine.

The new chairs for the committee room arrived in August. They have padded seats and backs and already are seen as a great improvement, especially by card players and the Craft ladies. There are also new tables in that room. Also in August the kitchen was inspected by Breckland and given a 5 star rating.

Book Club

"Far from the Madding Crowd" by Thomas Hardy



Written in 1874, the novel takes its name from a line in the poem 'Elegy written in a Country Churchyard' by Thomas Gray, which was a commentary on rural life, a subject close to Thomas Hardy's heart.



The first of Hardy's 'Wessex novels', the book follows the life of Bathsheba Everdene. She has inherited her uncle's farm and is determined to manage the running of the business without the help of a husband, under the watchful eye of the village and farm workers. As well as managing the farm, Bathsheba faces the advances of three potential suitors - the stable and reliable Gabriel Oak, the obsessive Mr Boldwood and the fey but dashing solider Sergeant Troy. Having toyed with the affections of Gabriel Oak and Mr Boldwood, Bathsheba's head is turned by the lothario Sergeant Troy who, unbeknownst to her, has already made a local girl (Fanny Robin) pregnant.

We were drawn into the book immediately by the first paragraph, which charmingly describes Gabriel Oak's smile. The amount of dialogue, particularly that in Dorsetshire dialect, made the book a challenging and time consuming read, but Hardy's writing painted a beautiful picture of the Wessex countryside. The book heavily relies on chance, therefore making some of the events seem far fetched, such as Fanny going to the wrong church when she was due to marry Sergeant Troy.

In the main, we enjoyed the book. *Tamara Drewe* by Posy Simmonds, which has also been made into a film, was recommended by one of the members and makes good further reading as a modernised version of *Far from the Madding Crowd*.

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the Library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "How to Build a Girl" by Caitlin Moran for discussion at our meeting on the 1st October and will read "We are all completely beside ourselves" by Karen Joy Fowler for discussion at our meeting on the 5th November. New members are always welcome.

Police report

PCSO Hayley Greenhall confirmed that the problems of anti-social behaviour around the village shop had reduced following letters being sent to the parents of youths who were misbehaving. Since the Village Hall opening, there has been no issue with youths on the recreation ground. Residents are encouraged to report any issues to 101.

To approve future projects/nominate a scheme to register for open space and play space provision and improvement

The PC felt that it was important not to discount section 106 projects that are not specifically play area and open space related. All community related projects were considered. It was agreed that the working group (set up at the previous meeting) should be given the opportunity to formulate projects for the recreation ground.

A letter was received from Breckland requesting proposed projects be costed, ready to go for when section 106 funding was available. It was unclear how funding would be distributed between parishes so the PC requested clarification.

Following discussion priorities were established as follows:

Village Hall surrounds – it was acknowledged that £1000 funding had already been received for a tree planter, tree and a brick built BBQ. Work was needed to the driveway and area outside the village hall and this would be a major project and require further consideration.

Recreation Ground new play equipment – it was accepted consultation with the community/play area users was needed before a proposal could be drafted.

Shelter for recreation ground -

Repair Church Clock – although the clock belongs to the church it was felt that it was a community asset and needed consideration.

To approve use of recreation ground for football sessions



Letter from Lyn

I find it hard to believe that it is already a year since Peter and myself moved to Norfolk. As I write this letter we have had the first of our many Harvest Festivals in the villages.

So much has happened in our lives during the last eighteen months. Peter felt he needed some quiet time to recover, so we have resolved to not start any more projects in either our home or my fathers until next year. Sometimes it is good to stop and reflect on what has happened to us. We can get caught up in the moment, swept along with whatever is currently concerning us and forgetting how much has changed.

My father, George, recently had a cataract operation on his left eye. We had been told that he was almost blind in it, although dad was largely unaware of this because of his dementia. He would say occasionally that things had got a bit blurry, but we noticed that he was reading his beloved books less and less. After his operation, he was much more aware of things around him. Recently he stopped and commented on a man who was standing right out on the end of the jib of a crane. Before his cataract was removed he would struggle to see the crane – let alone the man.

Last week, George had an appointment with the surgeon to check everything was healing properly. The surgeon asked George to read the letters on an eye chart using his newly repaired eye and without using his spectacles. As George struggled to identify even one of the letters, our hearts sank. We began to question whether the results had been as good as we thought at first. Then the consultant said with a completely straight face "George, try starting at the top of the chart". At which my dad rattled off all the letters reaching the second to last line before he hesitated.

In the hurly burly of our daily lives, it is easy to forget how things once were, to forget what we have achieved sometimes through our own efforts, but more often with the help and skills of other people.

Today we reap a Harvest that is so much more diverse than those of our ancestors. I believe that the wonderful medical procedures now available to us are just one example of this. Cataract removal operations return sight to so many, to enable people like George to live out their lives to the full.

When we take time to stop and think about it, today there are plenty of reasons to praise God for His goodness.
