Saturday 14th May in Foxley

Now that the six bells in Foxley Church have been restored, a team of experienced bell ringers, under the auspices of the Norwich Diocesan Association of Ringers (the NDA), will attempt to complete a 5,040-change peal in Cambridge Surprise Minor. The team will be led by Michael Clements, a national-level bellringer, from Norwich. The last time such a peal was recorded was in 1950.

Bell ringing is an art particularly associated with the Church of England, which restored it in the 17th century after the medieval bells were lost at the Reformation. It is specially linked to Norwich and Norfolk, as one of the first new sets of bells was installed over 300 years ago in St. Peter Mancroft church in Norwich. The English form of the art is only found here and in a very few English-speaking countries elsewhere, so is special to our English heritage.

Six bells give a choice of 720 possible combinations (or changes). The complete peal consists of seven repetitions of the 720 possible changes, each time in a different order, indicated by the peal title.

The complete peal is expected to last nearly 3 hours and will begin after the Village Lunch. During this time the six ringers will be ringing continuously without a break, and concentrating on keeping up their own part in the peal. This imposes considerable physical and mental demands on them, both as individuals and as a team, and requires great skill and long experience.

If the peal is successfully completed without any mistakes, it will be recorded in the records of the NDA and the national body, and will be publicly acknowledged in the magazine "Ringing World" and on the Bellboard website.

Michael Clements' visit is a special compliment to Foxley village and its church, and may not be repeated for some years. It comes from his personal interest in our bells, which led to the NDA giving the church a £6,000 grant towards the total restoration cost of more than £40,000, and to his work in training our team of ringers.

We hope that he and some of the ringers will come to the Village Lunch, so that you will be able to meet them there.

Bawdeswell Village Cinema [BVC] would like to thank all those who attended two recent fundraising events.

On 27th February some 100 eager participants battled for 1st place in the first ever BVC Quiz night. The winners were team 'Thelma & Louise'. This was a significant fundraising event for BVC to help cover the cost of our new projector lens and the Surround Sound installation. Due to the popularity of this event we have already booked the Village Hall for another Quiz Night on Saturday 25th February 2017.

A week later on 5th March an audience of 80 enjoyed a lecture by Roger Smith, a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, entitled 'A Shackleton Odyssey' recounting the historic Antarctic journey of Shackleton 100 years ago and also a recent Aurora expedition, in which he took part, retracing some of this journey including part of the climb over the mountains of South Georgia. Proceeds from the lecture were shared between BVC and the Charlie Waller Memorial Trust which also attracted a number of donations.



The Charlie Waller Memorial Trust was set up in 1998 in memory of Charlie Waller, a young man who took his own life whilst suffering from depression. Shortly after his death, his family founded the Trust in order to educate young people on the importance of staying mentally well and how to do so.

Computer file types

You may, as a Windows user like me, have been frustrated when you receive a file by email and can't open it. One way of preventing this is for everyone to send files in a .pdf or .jpg format but otherwise here is how Windows users can open two types of file which I recently received.

The 1st was a .odt or open document text file. For this use Word and in the bottom right corner of the 'open' box select the file type OpenDocument Text (*.odt). Select the file and click Open. You may well get error messages and, as long as you are happy with the source of the document, click OK and/or Yes. When the document opens you can then save it as a Word Document (*.docx).

The 2nd I received was a .pages document. Converting this is a little more complicated. Save the file into an appropriate folder and then locate it using Windows Explorer. Right click on the file name and then click Rename. Change .pages to .zip then double click on the file name to open it. Click Extract All Files and you can choose what folder to extract them to. Go to that folder and you will see a file preview.jpg. Right click on this file and choose Open With Microsoft Office Picture Manager. From here you can save the file with your chosen name and to the desired folder.

Austen's Mrs. Elton.

Book Club

"Emma" by Jane Austen and "Emma" by Alexander McCall Smith



"Is it a Romance?", asked one of our members at the March meeting when we discussed mostly the Jane Austen version.

Of course the answer is "yes it is", but it is also so much more.

There are four matchings in total in the novel, two of them follow the structure of a Romance to the letter: boy meets girl, complications, resolution. The third plot covering the Elton's marriage is man seeks wife to increase his income, woman seeks husband for social position. Austen gave Mrs. Elton some great cringe making lines, think Mrs. Bouquet/Bucket's telephone soliloquies when she bragged about her sister's home; the writer of that series must have based her/his character on

Emma is the main protagonist, the novel is about her, the title makes that clear and Austen admitted creating "a heroine no one else would like". Jane Austen has cleverly turned the plot structure on its head. Emma and Mr. Knightly have known each other for years and are friends. She has £32,000 a year and a social position running her father's home and confidently can announce that she will never marry, but then she doesn't need to for either of the reasons that made marriage for the Elton's necessary. Mr. Knightly is equally secure. He recognises that he loves Emma but with her character faults she is not worthy of his love. Until she recognises that she has been wrongly interfering with the lives of others, assuming scenarios and sometimes being deliberately hurtful and becomes contrite she is unworthy of his love. It is when one of the other young women voices her feelings for Mr. Knightly that Emma's jealous reaction makes her aware that she loves him. Emma desperately needs to be redeemed and eventually it is Mr. Knightly's love and her awakening self knowledge that redeems her.

Emma's haughtiness and superior attitude is not liked by readers, but her purpose in the novel is to show that an independent income, being spoilt and not properly educated, can give confidence, if not right-mindedness. There needed to be a character that had the opportunities that the other female characters didn't have. Jane Austen was writing about the inequality of women's lives in the early 19th century. The marrying couples, the doting mother, the difference in status of a governess and a wife, and the widows and spinsters in the novel are there to demonstrate the lives of women and highlight the lack of choices. was their only option unless they had something like £32,000 a year, and the only question was to what level of male society they could aspire. Jane Austen has been accused of only being interested in money but this novel clearly shows that she believed more than that is needed for marriage and more life choices were needed for women. It hasn't been read for the last 200 years for nothing, it is truly a classic.

The Alexander McCall Smith version is part of an Austen project where modern writers are being invited to re-write her novels and update the stories to a contempory setting. This was read and enjoyed by members, we feel sure McCall Smith had a lot of fun modernising it and it is fun to read. He sets the novel in Norfolk with references to Holt and Gresham's, etc. so that added a bit more interest for us.





Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting 8th March 2016

Present: D. Shannon (Chair), W. Mason, J. Lilwall, J. Mallen, R. Reed and B. Cunliffe, and Mrs. J. Boxall (Clerk).

Bus Shelter

The bus shelter on Norwich Road was vandalised last month. Residents may have noticed that roof tiles were broken, the felt ripped, seat pillars were seriously damaged and the seating removed. Repairs will cost £212 and the money will need to come out of Parish Council funds as the excess on the PC insurance is £250. The incident was reported to the Police and the Parish Council has now agreed to commission the repair of the facility as soon as possible. Meanwhile, it would urge residents to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity in this area or elsewhere in the village. Bawdeswell cannot afford to mop up after mindless vandalism!

Recreation Ground Car Park

Thanks were expressed to Cllr Shannon for all his efforts in managing the grant funding applications. The PC agreed at their last meeting to earmark £11,000 towards the cost of refurbishment. A match funding request for £10,840 was submitted to Breckland DC but is being held in abeyance pending the outcome of an alternative grant funding application (as suggested by Breckland DC) for £11,400. Other grant funding bodies are being considered for further applications. It is hoped that refurbishment might include the driveway as a continuation of the project. The Parish Council would like to express their gratitude for the amazing response to the PC's continuing request for donations. To date £7,566.50 has been received from resident's donations which is AMAZING! Thank you!

In discussing the major refurbishment of the Recreation Ground car parking area, the Parish Council accepted that, due to the recent inclement weather, temporary repairs were proving difficult. It is therefore hoped that the main repair work can go ahead mid-June subject to sufficient funding being received.

Can you help turn a swimming pool into a car park? The recreation ground car park is in dire need of refurbishment, particularly drainage, without which the new Village Hall and recreational facilities will suffer. The cost is estimated at over £36,000 and we need help. The PC is currently looking at possible grant funding, but to be successful we need to demonstrate willingness by the community to dig deep into our pockets. Can you help?

Other Issues of Interest

Residents may be aware that the Parish Council, last July, elected to take over responsibility for the provision and maintenance of electric lighting in the village, such as it is. Breckland, which paid for the facility up until last July, now recompenses Bawdeswell for the cost instead. However, the Parish Clerk is now seeking to ensure that this compensation provided is adequate to meet the need.

The Parish Clerk has also had some success in getting Highways to agree to repair the cracked drains in Reepham Road which has caused flooding in recent years.

Courtesy of a recent grant of £1,000 from Breckland, a local builder will shortly be installing a BBQ facility in the Recreation Ground, close to the Village Hall and bowling green for use by residents. Please feel free to make best use of it once it is commissioned, but please respect that others will wish to use the facility after you.

Noting that the consultation process on the developing Breckland Local Plan, the Parish Council was grateful for the responses provided by residents in addition to its own comments provided on your behalf. We now keenly await the next iteration to see if Breckland has listened to our voices opposing the designation of the village as a Local Service Centre.


