Breckland Local Plan

Breckland Council has issued consultancy documents for the development of the Local Plan. This is a key document that is hoped will guide development in the District over the next 20 years. Its aim is to set out how the Council will deliver its vision through the planning process and the policies against which planning applications will be assessed. The Council is therefore keen to hear the views of all interested parties to help shape a draft Local Plan.

The documents can be viewed on line at http://consult.breckland.gov.uk. Part 1 is titled Breckland Local Plan Preferred Directions and Part 2 is Emerging Sites. Most of the information does not relate to Foxley; but Bawdeswell, North Elmham and Swanton Morley are more involved.

There is to be a consultation period from 11 January until 22 February and in that time there will be several meetings where people can find out more about the Local Plan. There will be drop-in events in several towns - the nearest to us will be either at **Dereham Memorial Hall** on **28th January from 2pm to 7pm** or at **North Elmham Institute Hall** on **4th February from 2pm to 7pm**. The development of the Local Plan will also be the main topic for discussion at Foxley's next Parish Council Meeting at 7:30 on February 11th in Foxley Village Hall where we will welcome everyone's views.

There will be hard copies of the information on view at various libraries and council offices, the nearest to us being:

Breckland Council Offices, Elizabeth House, Dereham or Dereham Customer Services Centre, Breckland Business Centre, St Withburga Lane, Dereham or Dereham Library.

Elmham and Swanton Morley Surgeries

The article below, written by Practice Manager Judith Wood, outlines changes that have had to be made to working practices as a result of three Doctors leaving. Extensive advertising by the surgery to date has only enabled one Doctor to be recruited to replace the three leaving. The shortage of GPs is a nationwide problem but is particularly acute in Norfolk. This was brought to the attention of Junior Health Minister, local M.P. George Freeman, at a meeting organised on December 11th by Swanton Morley and Elmham Surgeries Patient Participation Groups (PPGs).

New Ways of Working

From the 4th January 2016, we will be making changes to the way we offer appointments, home visits and telephone consultations. Drs Jennings, Hadinnapola and Coghill will be leaving at the end of December 2015 – I am sure you will join us in wishing them well in the future. During December and January we will be joined by a new GP and seven new nurses. The nurses will now take the lead in most first consultations. The Nurse Practitioners are advanced level nurses who are able to prescribe and refer you for investigations or to the hospital. We are also recruiting a Pharmacist, a Physiotherapist and a Mental Health Nurse: the pharmacist will be able to answer questions about medication; the physiotherapist can see muscle aches and joint pains or injuries and the mental health nurse can help anxiety and depression. We may need to ask you more detailed guestions at reception - please don't be concerned, our Staff are not prying, they are trying to make sure you see the best person for your needs promptly and that may not be a doctor. Please be guided by the receptionists, they are receiving additional training and they will be acting on the instructions of the Partners on how we are implementing the changes. Thank you for your help and support whilst we make these changes.

Judith Wood, Practice Manager

In a recent article in the Dereham Times (Dec 31st 2015), Judith Wood was quoted: "The GPs will focus on caring for patients with complex needs, palliative care of patients at the end of their life and complex mental health patients. We are doing all we can to provide a sustainable primary care service, despite facing very difficult circumstances in Dereham and the local area." There was also a detailed recognition by George Freeman M.P. of the extreme difficulties facing a number of local surgeries. These had been brought to his attention at the PPG meeting on Dec. 11th. He has clearly taken on board the need to insist on more "joined up policy making" involving Breckland District Council (Planning), Norfolk County Council (Education and Social Services), and NHS England (GP Practices and Mental Health). 

Book Club "Chapman's Odessey" by Paul Bailey



I recommended this for our group because I'd enjoyed reading it earlier this year. It might seem a surprising choice, but I was looking for a book that would blot out some of the worries surrounding my husband's impending stay in hospital. Husband had said it was well written and the cover mentioned humour.

Surprisingly, considering the circumstances and the content, I was very diverted and really enjoyed the way the story unfolded. Perhaps it hints at my dark humour. And I'm pleased to report that others in our group enjoyed it too and my second, probably less manic reading, showed me things that I'd missed the first time round.

Harry Chapman is in hospital without, it seems, a clear diagnosis. He is now where he feared to be. His world is made up of conversations with different people. Doctors, nurses and fellow patients have a clear presence, but there are others he converses with who are less so. Perhaps ghosts from his past or previously enjoyed books. We learn his story through his conversations with the quick and the dead. He is a fortunate patient. He can remember remarkable poetry and gives recitations. These convince the medical staff that he is still a person not just a stricken body. My second reading helped me enjoy these literary pieces, many of which, I was sadly ignorant. If you're like me, this could give you a quick introduction to some of the classical masterpieces.

Harry is bound up with guilt - not living up to his mother's standards, too much success, forgetting his roots, doubtful sexual liaisons and friendships with shady characters. Hard topics to deal with, but the telling is very funny too. Yes, it's another book I'd recommend.

Update on Village Hall projects

Various proposals for village projects were received for consideration

The Council **resolved to approve** the purchase of hawthorn saplings for hedging with wire and post (as appropriate) to the value of £300, as proposed by Cllr Shannon, seconded by Cllr Lilwall and approved by majority with 2 abstentions and 1 objection. The hedging would be put in to try and prevent children running across the car park (in front of cars) from the play area.

Church Clock - As competitive quotes were circulated for consideration, the PC unanimously confirmed their approval to grant £879.41 recycling monies towards the repair of the church clock. It was confirmed that other funding has been obtained to make up the short fall.

Village Hall driveway and car parking area - Research into the costs involved with resurfacing the village hall car parking area were ongoing but an initial quote of £45,000 was received for a tarmac surface with space for 45 – 50 cars. Concern was expressed as there was no provision for drainage in the quote provided. Additional soakaways may be required.

Precept 2016/17

The Clerk circulated draft budget proposals for 2016/17. Following discussion the Council **resolved to approve a precept request of £17,500,** the same as 2015/16 as proposed by Cllr Mallen, seconded by Cllr Lilwall and approved with 1 against. A copy of the approved budget can be viewed on the Council website. It was reported that the Parish Grant Allocation would be £803 and paid in addition to the precept request.

Local Plan Preferred Directions Consultation 11th January to 22nd February

2016: Breckland Council is consulting on the Local Plan and is inviting comment on the key issues and priorities that should be considered when shaping planning policy in Breckland in the next 20 years. This policy has a direct impact on Bawdeswell as the village has been designated as a Local Service Centre Village and therefore suitable for further housing development.



"A Shackleton Odyssey"

by Roger Smith Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society

2016 marks the 100th anniversary of the dramatic rescue by Sir Ernest Shackleton of his crew from the *Endurance*. Shackleton's epic journey into Antarctica in 1914-1916 has been described as one of the most astonishing feats of exploration and human courage ever recorded. The expedition's boat, the *Endurance*, was first trapped in the ice and then crushed before sinking; after which the party camped on ice-floes until they had to make their onward journey to Elephant Island in three lifeboats. From here Shackleton and five others completed the 850 mile sea passage to South Georgia in the 22 foot long lifeboat *James Caird*. On landing on the wrong side of the island he and two others crossed the glaciers of South Georgia eventually reaching Stromness from where the successful rescue of all of his men began.

This lecture by Roger Smith, a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, tells the story of an Aurora Expeditions' party, of which he was a member. 95 years later (in 2011), they retraced some of the original journey. After visiting the Antarctic Peninsular, an ice-strengthened boat, the *Polar Pioneer*, moved to the position where Shackleton's party took to the lifeboats in the Weddell Sea. From here it closely followed the original route to Elephant Island and South Georgia, where a successful crossing following Shackleton's route from King Haskon Bay to Stromness was made, with two nights spent camped on the glaciers.
