



The previous Village Sign has been refurbished by Ailsa McColville and will be hung in pride of place in the Village Hall. It was replaced by the current sign in 2011 but had been standing on the village green for nearly 30 years, since 1982. A competition with a £5 prize was run to design it, which was won by 15 year old Mark Fairhurst, a pupil at Reepham High School. It was carved by Harry Carter of Swaffham and was the last of a number of similar signs he produced. We're delighted that it is being retained in the village where it can be seen by all and protected from the weather.

The recent successful Tony's Trosh donated £570 to the Village Hall in memory of Chris Hood who was a worker for the new building and a wonderful supporter and fundraiser. It is planned to purchase something special. We are also holding a donation in memory of Les Beach who worked tirelessly as a volunteer Caretaker for several years and there are plans afoot to put those funds to good use also. At our October meeting we discussed the possibility of helping to fund floodlighting for the Children's football out of residue BAG money.

Our Treasurer, William Mason, who has done the most fantastic job setting up the accounting system that helps manage the Hall is stepping down. He has been Treasurer of the Village Hall since July 2012 and before that of Project Bawdeswell. Without William making sense of the financial requirements of the Lottery we would never have got through the rigours of that process. He has worked tirelessly and given hours of his time to make the new Hall a reality. He can never be thanked enough. BVH is extremely fortunate to have Jason Waller willing to take over the Treasurer's role and we are very grateful to him. Our Annual Report and Accounts have been lodged with the Charity Commission for the year to 31st March 2016.

Business Feature: Scribbles Pre-School

This month, we'd like to thank Scribbles Pre-school for giving us an insight into their staff and the qualifications they hold.

Firstly, we are all mothers and we treat the children uniquely and individually. However we do all hold more than just experience as our qualifications...

All staff hold the mandatory Paediatric First Aid Certificate, DBS checks, Current Safeguarding Award and Food Hygiene Certificate. We have 2 Lead Safeguarding Officers on the premises, one of which is always on site. We are planning to have a qualified teacher on site within the next 2 years in keeping with government recommendations for Early Years Childcare.

Debbie Williams is the owner and manager of the preschool. She holds a BA (Hons) in Inclusive Practice and Integrated working and a FdA in Children's Care, Learning and Development. She also has other training such as: Supporting Children who are Bereaved, Physical Harm, Child Sexual Exploitation training, Domestic Abuse & its impact on families, Autism Awareness, Special Educational Needs and more. Previously Debbie worked in a male prison supporting the prisoner's children and families and teaching prisoners a 6 week parenting programme. From this Deborah took on a new role as a lead Pastoral Learning Mentor in a school, where she supported children and their families in all different areas. Following on from this Scribbles Pre-school was created.

Anna Moody is the Deputy Manager of the pre-school. She has gained her qualifications and experience working with children through volunteering in a local primary school. She has been at Scribbles Preschool since it opened in April 2015. Anna holds a Level 3 in Early Years and Level 4 in Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector. She also has completed other training such as: Safeguarding Lead Practitioner, promoting positive behaviour, developing & supporting sustained shared thinking & promoting social stories. Anna will be completing her Special Educational Needs training and her Level 5 in Children's Care, Learning & Development in Autumn 2016.

Wendy Cottrell is our trainee nursery nurse who is completing her Level 2 in Childcare. Wendy started off at Scribbles as a Parent helper, but with increasing knowledge of caring for children, she decided on working with children as a career.

Go Set a Watchman is the novel Harper Lee originally submitted to her publishers before To Kill a Mockingbird. It was written in the mid 1950s and re-visits Jean Louise (Scout), Atticus Finch and the town of Maycome in Alabama. In this novel Jean Louise is twenty six, living and working in New York, and returning to Maycombe for her annual two week visit to her family and friends.



We find Atticus aged seventy-two, still working as a lawyer but suffering badly from arthritis, Jem has died and Scout rather diffidently resumes her romance with Hank, her father's young partner, who she thinks she might marry some day. One night she discovers that both Hank and her father are part of an organisation dedicated to preserving racial segregation. The hero of her childhood, who has taught her all she knows about fairness and equality, seems to be revealed as a racist and a bigot.

It is difficult to separate this book from its prequel (sequel?) and many of the parts within it resonate with Mockingbird, in particular the passages about Jean Louise's childhood, but perhaps that is what one must do to enjoy it. Those group members who had not read To Kill a Mockingbird seemed to enjoy it most.

The dialogue is clunky at times and the ending is a little rushed as though Harper Lee had lost faith in it. As one member said you can almost hear the publisher saying 'I think there's a story here, perhaps you could do more about the children and this case he defended'. There was a story there and this wasn't quite it but it can still be enjoyed for its insights, wit and humour.

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "Mr. Mac and Me" by Emma Freud for discussion at our meeting on the 3rd November 2016. We will read "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens and "Hotel du Lac" By Anita Bruckner for discussion at our meeting on 1st December New members always welcome.



We begin the month with the season of All Saints (1st) and All Souls (2nd). It is my intention in future years to hold a service of remembrance for our loved ones, who have died, around All Souls' Day – a time of quiet reflection when we can once again give thanks for all they have meant to us. It can be both a poignant and comforting experience for those who have been bereaved.

And then our attention turns to All Saints: many of us have our favourites (mine is St Francis, but he's a hard role-model to follow!). Three of our churches in the Heart of Norfolk Team have the dedication All Saints, and Stibbard Church celebrates its re-opening, following restoration works, on 30th October, with joy and thanks-giving all-round. But the 'saints' of the Church are not just those who have died and been consecrated by the Church, but the living saints who work tirelessly for the Church today. And to those, I would also like to give my heartfelt thanks.

13th November is Remembrance Sunday, when we will once again honour all those who have died in the service of our country and bring before God all those who serve in our Armed Forces today, and their families. I'm sure all our hearts are breaking when we look at some of the situations in the world today and feel so completely helpless. As we will hear in the Gospel-reading on Remembrance Sunday: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom". Man's inhumanity towards man doesn't change across the centuries; we can only pray for peace and that God's kingdom will come and his will be done.

Before I forget – Guy Fawkes Night! Of course, it reminds us of past tensions between the Catholic Church and the (then) relatively new Church of England. Hopefully, those days are long-gone and we now enjoy and celebrate our common faith and heritage. Do make the most of this season of remembrance and bring to God your most treasured memories.
