Bawdeswell Primary's outdoor learning area

During their Forest School sessions in January and February, the children undertook a bird project which was great fun. Led by the Bawdeswell's Forest School teachers Ms. Ladbrooke and Mrs Shepherd, they learnt about different bird species that visit the woods, and their diets. They made a variety of bird feeders which cleared very quickly and recreated bird nests from willow and dogwood.

The theme for this half term is trees. The children will learn how to identify different species, make bark rubbings and complete leaf art. There will also be campfire cookery and the making of damper bread twists.

Work on enhancing the school's outdoor learning area is progressing nicely. We have submitted an application to the Tesco Bags for Help grant scheme and wait to see if we have been short listed. Funding will help us buy equipment and tools to enhance the planned wildlife area and vegetable garden. A pond design competition has been held within school – with some brilliant, creative designs. A winner from each year group was selected and every entrant received a prize.

MANY THANKS to those who have shown their support already for this project. Thanks to Mark Webster from the Trust for Conservation Volunteers for his advice and Rebecca Leech from Bawdeswell for her kind donation of plant pots and tubs. Thanks to Kate Thompson, Manager at B&Q Fakenham for so kindly offering around 50 bags of compost, tins of paint and several child's trugs through the B&Q Community Reuse Scheme. Finally, huge thanks go to John Labouchere of North Elmham and Julie Withero from Bawdeswell who very kindly spent an afternoon collecting the compost and unloading it at the school along with Mr Lord, the school's head teacher— not a light undertaking! That compost will give our raised beds the excellent start they need - their efforts are much appreciated.



A short review for a book of short stories!

"Short" being the operative word as some amounted to 3 or 4 pages and one just a single sentence. All, however, packed a punch.

Jon McGregor is famed for writing about the ordinary. But his skill is that he parachutes the reader in mid-way into a situation/incident leaving you questioning "but what happened before this? How did they cope after afterwards?" As one of the group said "like going past on the bus and glimpsing a scene, without knowing what happened before or after."

In the case of the one liner about a fire taking hold sooner that expected, you end up making your own story.

This was one of the reasons a number of the group did not enjoy the read and it left our group divided. Some admiring his brilliance and others finding him pretentious - a criticism I have read in other reviews of his work.

Having just finished his new novel, Reservoir 13, I really enjoy his writing style but the beauty of our Book Club is that you read books you would not normally choose. Sometimes you enjoy them, and sometime you don't!

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "After the Fire, A Still Small Voice" by Evie Wyld for discussion at our meeting on 5th April and will read "A Night on the Orient Express" by Veronica Henry for discussion on 3th May. We were very sorry to hear that the Revd Tom Candeland had died. He fell at his home in Lyng and banged his head rather badly. He was airlifted to the N & N and after a long operation failed to recover and died on Sunday 11th February. It was a great shock to his family and friends.

Tom was for many years a non-stipendary minister in our former Benefice, meaning he received no pay for his work, and he took many services here in Bawdeswell and Foxley. He was also a Hospital Chaplain at the N & N, and for several years Rural Dean, organising and taking services across the Sparham Deanery. On top of all that he found time as an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral to take the occasional evening service there. Tom was a good servant to the Church and to all of us.

Following his funeral at St Faiths Crematorium on 1st March, a Service of Thanksgiving was held in Bawdeswell church which he has been attending regularly in recent times. It was during that week we were all snowed up, nevertheless over 60 people turned out to remember him. The service was led by the Revd Sally Kimmis, our Rector, and the address given by the Revd David Head who was in post here at the time of Tom's ministry. Dawn Williamson from Themelthorpe sang a moving solo "God be in my head" and James Lilwall played the organ. The village hall laid on tea afterwards and the family provided cakes.

Tom, we will miss you.

The collection taken at Tom Candeland's service is being divided between Bawdeswell and Lyng churches, and we thank the family for that.

We have also received an anonymous gift of £2,000 from an elderly Bawdeswell resident totally disconnected from the above, and hugely appreciated at a time when we are finding it a real struggle to keep the church going in our Benefice. Thank you so much.

We are looking forward to our 10.30am Easter Sunday service and hope see as many non regular church-goers as we did at Christmas. There will be an Easter Egg Hunt and refreshments after the service.

Church Letter

April is the middle month of the northern hemisphere's spring, though as I write these notes spring seems to be a long way still. But hopefully by the time you read them the weather will have improved and we will be witnessing warmer and brighter weather.

The thought of spring brings to mind three word "Hope Springs Eternal" from a poem written by Alexander Pope. Certainly as a bird watcher and a volunteer at Sculthorpe Moor Nature Reserve, this month is a month of transition. On the reserve we look forward to and hope for the return of spring migrants such as the cuckoo, swallow and swift that herald the coming of summer.

In our gardens we see the effect of the sun warming the soil to help the perennial plants there to spring back into life. Then of course the annual flower and vegetable seeds that we have sown are starting their journey which will give us pleasure and sustenance later in the year.
