Bawdeswell Primary outdoor learning area - a call for help

The recently established Forest School sessions at Bawdeswell Primary have proven extremely popular with the children. Since September each of the children spends a 2 hour lesson fortnightly in the woodland area of the school grounds; the reception children have a weekly hour. Here, in all weathers, they learn about the natural environment while developing confidence and skills for den-building, handling tools, tying knots, woodland crafts and having campfires.

The children are inspired by these experiences as it taps into their creativity and initiative to solve problems and cooperate with each other. As volunteer helpers and parents we know that the children, regardless of their age, really enjoy this opportunity to spend part of their learning time in the woods as it adds another interesting dimension to their school life.

Due to this success, there is a desire by the school to enhance the outdoor learning space by creating a wildlife area and vegetable garden adjacent to the woods. These will provide even greater opportunities for the children to care about the natural world and develop skills to grow their own food.

Different funding options are being explored to help improve these outdoor resources, but to make it a real success, we also NEED YOUR HELP! If you are able to offer any of the following or similar, please get in touch:

Book Club

"The Noise of Time" by Julian Barnes

This slim novel is a fictionalisation of parts of the life of Shostakovitch. his internal struggle with the Soviet state, and his desire to be left alone to compose. His work is at times lauded and he is feted as the premier composer of the USSR. At other times he is publicly denounced which is effectively a death sentence. On more than one occasion he stands throughout the night by the lift in his apartment block with a small suitcase, ready to be taken away.

Shostakovitch refers to himself as a coward; he denounces fellow composers when required and delivers speeches written for him even though he opposes the content. Barnes however gives us the sense that Shostakovitch was a conflicted, complicated individual with his own moral code.

Barnes employs a narrative style that at first appears to be erratic, with short paragraphs, hopping randomly from subject to subject. As the novel progresses each observation or experience is revisited and developed several times giving the reader deeper insight into Shostakovitch's motivation and experience.

"The Mistletoe Murder and Other Stories" by P.D. James

This slim volume contains four short stories written over a period from 1969 to 1996 and published in 2016 two years after the death of the author. They are all murder mysteries. The first is set in a family gathering at an English country house in 1940s, narrated by a bestselling crime novelist. The second is defined by one of the characters as the 'usual story of illicit passion and general stupidity'. It is, of course, anything but. The final two stories feature Adam Dalgleish, one of which is a clever homage to Agatha Christie. He is surely one of the best fictional detectives especially when portrayed by Roy Marsden in the TV series.

PD James says in the preface she enjoyed the challenge of short story writing which she says has a restricted scope and so needs a single good theme which is well plotted with good characterisation and a surprise ending for the reader. Book club members, some of whom do not usually appreciate short stories were in general agreement that she achieved these aims. We enjoyed reading the book and there was an animated discussion about some aspects of the plots and endings.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "Family Album" by Penelope Lively for discussion at our meeting on 1st February. New members always welcome. Enquiries: Carolyn Good 01362 688944

Foxley Parish Council Meeting held on 17th December

Present: Mr N Mears (Chairman), Mr N Hatch (Vice-Chairman), Mr M Watson, Mrs G Blyth, Mr G Bambridge (District Councillor), Mrs L Rose (clerk) Members of the public: 14

Mr D Barrett sent a letter stating his intention to resign from the council. NM accepted his resignation with regret and thanked Mr Barrett for his many years loyal service to the council.

Reporting on items from previous meeting

- Bus shelter: council considered the quotes for the bus shelter from Queensbury and Westcotec. Quote from Westcotec accepted for two 2-bay shelters £4,675 x 2 = £9,350 (+VAT) Clerk to proceed with the grant application to Parish Partnership Scheme. In addition, GB suggested applying to the Breckland Community Fund.
- War Memorial: Concern about the state of the War Memorial caused by the overhanging tree. The tree is also now shedding branches. Clerk instructed to contact landowner Matthew Skinner, initially by phone but if that is unsuccessful by letter. Clerk to check preservation status of the trees and if necessary contact the Council who will invoice the landowner for any work.

Planning matters

18 dwellings on Old Fakenham Rd – although rejected by 6 votes to 5 votes by the planning committee, an appeal against the decision has been launched. Letter to Breckland restating the views of the council. New application – similar to before but now 9 rather than 7 affordable houses. Concern expressed from residents present about the increase in traffic on the narrow roads and comments (mainly objections) similar to those of public meeting in March 2017.

Council vote: For 2 Against 2 Public vote: For 2 Against 10

Edwards Barn: application for change of use. Council vote: For 0 Against 3 Abstain

Retrospective planning permission for Rectory Cottage Old Fakenham Road. It was felt that because of the large number of changes and the size of the changes the council should request an enforcement of the original planning order. Councillors and residents were opposed to the retrospective request.

Saffron Housing Trust – Nothing further has been heard – some councillors and residents not happy with the prospect of 18 + 6 new houses in Foxley .




