

"Nora Webster " by Colm Tóibín



The novel opens with Nora Webster trying to avoid any contact with neighbours and her extended family. She is a newly widowed woman who wants to be left alone - she believes this is the best way to protect herself and her two young sons (her two daughters are older and away at school and college). The novel is written from Nora's perspective in Tóibín's typical plain prose style.

As the story develops we are immersed in the life of a woman and her family in 1960s small town Ireland. She is a flawed, complex character who appears to be emotionally cool, especially towards her sons who she nevertheless deeply loves. As Nora resentfully returns to work in order to enhance her low income, domestic life is gradually influenced by external events and characters beyond the immediate family. She also starts to enjoy music although this too is initially accepted into her life in a resentful way. As Nora becomes more outward facing and modern she reflects changes that are happening at the time in Ireland itself.

The novel is structured chronologically over approximately four years and references real political events in a convincing way. It is evocative and believable, based around Enniscorthy in County Wexford.

It is testimony to Tóibín's ability to create convincing characters and settings in compelling stories of everyday life that we were able to discuss Nora and her story as we might a real person.

Colm Tóibín is also a prolific essayist and journalist, a playwright and poet. Nora Webster was published in 2014 and revisits many of the themes explored in earlier books, especially family life in a small community in the south-east of Ireland.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "His Bloody Project" by Graeme Macrae Burnet for discussion at our next meeting on 5th July. Over the summer we plan to read "My Name is Leon" by Kit de Waal for discussion on 2nd August, "The Report" by Jessica Francis Kane for discussion on 6th September and "Elizabeth is Missing" by Emma Healey for discussion on 4th October. You will have noticed the scaffolding has gone. The repairs to the spire turned out to be more urgent than at first realised. A lot of the oak at the base of the spire was waterlogged and rotten. It has been replaced with old reclaimed oak and will weather to match in time.

In the past the tower of the medieval church collapsed, the Victorian church was destroyed in WWII, a new disaster has just been averted.

Thanks are due to locals Paul Buck, Andrew Partlow, Johnny Woodhouse and Kenny Spearing for helping with the repairs. Paul and Andrew also helped yours truly to mend the rear clock on the tower by taking the hands off it and enabling me to remove the movement to my kitchen table. It is now back and working.

All of this and the recent repainting of the church windows by Charles Seamen has been enabled by the Friends of Bawdeswell Church, whom we gratefully thank once again. Without them the church would fall into disrepair. There is no other source of money to maintain this building for our village. Please do continue to support all the regular Friends of the Church fundraising events.

Many churches are suffering from lack of interest and support just now, which is sad because of their history and in many cases fascinating architecture. Foxley now has no Churchwarden and no PCC. It is in danger of being locked up and neglected. Other churches in our Benefice and across Norfolk are in similar trouble.

At a recent PCC meeting we were asked if we would consider adopting Foxley church. After much consideration and discussion the PCC sadly felt they couldn't take on the further responsibilities that this would mean. The PCC would have to take on maintaining the graveyard, the building maintenance and the manning of any occasional services.

Our Treasurer, fellow churchwarden Andrew Toomey, has agreed to look after their accounts. That is sadly all we can do to help.

#### **Church Letter**

Dear Friends,

The end of July sees the start of the school summer holidays. For some children living within our parishes it will be a time of transition. Some will be moving from primary to secondary education whilst others move on to Tertiary education at University. Some will be leaving education completely, hoping to find a job.

It's a long time ago, but when I left school in the 1960s, I remember saying to my mother that I would take my holiday and not start looking for work until the beginning of September. When I did, I found a job within two days, not so easy to do nowadays.

Holidays as we know them are relatively new and in the middle ages the ordinary peasant would only have time off from work for religious festivals (Holy Days). It wasn't until the early 19th century that working class people even had Sundays off. Seaside holidays were only taken by the wealthy, beginning in the late 18th century and holidays for the working class did not arrive until the 1890s but most were too poor to do so. Some London Eastenders would take a working holiday in the hopfields of Kent. Until 1939 most people only had a paid holiday on Bank Holidays. It was in that year that a law entitling everyone to one week's paid holiday was passed.

The word holiday to me means a rest from the labours of work. I'm not sure that happens nowadays. I remember quite recently walking along the promenade at West Bay in Dorset and seeing a lady with a resigned look on her face as the gentlemen beside her was on his mobile discussing a work problem.

Remembering that after his labour of Creation, God rested, I wish you all a relaxing and refreshing break from yours.


