

Bawdeswell Parish Council update

We now have a full complement of councillors (7) with Ken Ewing filling the vacancy, a very welcome addition.

In view of the recent adverse weather conditions we have asked Highways Department to include The Street to their list of roads to be gritted. Currently Reepham Road to the Fakenham Road, and the Fakenham Road are the only roads gritted in Bawdeswell. The Street is well used by vehicles and buses so we will see what response we get from Highways.

There is no sign at the moment of a commencement of the building of 40 dwellings on Two Fields Way. Normally building should begin within three years of the granting of planning permission. I am sure that Bawdeswell Parish Council will object if the developer's delay is to enable them to submit another application to increase the number of dwellings on the site.

VILLAGE NEWS

Breckland Council have completed their 'Local Plan' and is awaiting its ratification. Amongst other things the plan identifies villages they consider suitable for future development, and Bawdeswell has been designated a Local Service Centre. We objected to being so designated at every opportunity but were unsuccessful.

However, as a result of our campaigning Breckland has limited our allocation to 40 new dwellings to be built in the next 25 years, and that the granting of planning permission for the 40 dwellings in Two Fields Way means we have already reached Breckland's target. They suggest that small developments of one or two houses built within the Settlement Boundary during the remainder of the 25 year period might be possible but that is all.

If this is the case, I personally would be very pleased, but experience has shown that Breckland is very much in the hands of Central Government. If it is decreed by them that the numbers of new builds has to be increased in the Breckland area, Bawdeswell and other Local Service Centres would then become target areas. Rest assured your Parish Council will do all it can to keep Bawdeswell the lovely village it is today.

Finally, once again some mindless person - not necessarily from Bawdeswell, has thrown the life buoy into the water at Adams Pit. It will be returned to its rightful place as soon as possible but in the meantime please take care. Words fail me!

Book Club "Family Album" by Penelope Lively



Written in her 80s this is Penelope Lively's 16th novel. But more than 20 years after winning the Booker Prize with 'Moon Tiger', Lively still displays sharply contemporary observations on family life.

Allersmead, a typically middle class Edwardian villa, has been home for many years to Alison and Charles Harper, their au pair Ingrid, and the six children who have now grown up and mostly scattered to very different jobs both in England and abroad. Alison is a committed home-loving mother who has never had any trouble getting pregnant and delights in cooking for her large family, while Charles is a writer, more comfortable shut away in his study than participating in noisy family life around the kitchen table. As the children grow up, Alison is bewildered as they turn into independent beings she hardly recognises, and Lively captures the impossibility of ever really knowing other people, even siblings, as they exhibit an emotional coolness in their adult relationships. The novel is peopled with characters who are well-drawn and convincingly human.

Initially presented as a 'shrine' to an idealised vision of a close-knit family, it quickly becomes clear that all is not as it seems at Allersmead, and beneath this homely surface a 'dark alien presence' is more than once alluded to. What did actually happen during those childhood games in the cellar? Why did Gina's birthday party come to such an abrupt end? Why does Clare not resemble her brothers and sisters? There is an unspoken awareness of an unmentionable secret. Alison's assertions that they are a 'real old-fashioned family' are contrasted with the perceptions of the other family members in a series of mini narratives as each person remembers events differently from their shared past.

The novel swings smoothly between past and present tense, and first- and thirdperson as Lively encourages us to question the nature and truth of memory. When the secrets are revealed, however, they are perhaps less dramatic than we had expected. This aspect is a disappointment in a novel that is otherwise extremely readable, and was much enjoyed by the majority of book club members.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We will discuss "This Isn't The Sort Of Thing That Happens To Someone Like You" by Jon McGregor at our meeting on 1st March, and then we will read "After The Fire A Still Small Voice" by Evie Wyld. The Beck is an enthusiastic group which meets on the second Monday of each month at 7.30pm in the Old School Room at Sparham.

This month Fay Jones gave us a wonderful presentation "in defence of the stinging nettle!". We learnt so much but space permits me to share only a small part of this.

The sting of some nettles in NZ can kill a guinea pig but here in the UK we have much less aggressive varieties! Nettles are a wetland species and grow well in areas where there are high nutrient levels, for example, graveyards. As a species they are survivors as no animals want to eat them. They are home to lots of insects including ladybirds and butterflies.

To man they can be used as a tonic or diuretic. They contain more iron than spinach and are used as a green food colouring in sweets! They can be used to make pesto, nettle wine or nettle vodka. They have been eaten by man as far back as the Bronze Age and woven into cloth. During WW1 nettles were used as a dye for sandbags but today they are most often used as a fertiliser by gardeners

Our next meeting is on March 12th and includes some competitive jigsaw making!

We will continue to run a very varied programme in 2018 and non-members are always welcome to join us.

Following discussion it was unanimously agreed that the Clerk would be the Data Protection Officer, a requirement set out in the new General Data Protection Regulations as proposed by Cllr Cunliffe. It was unanimously agreed to approve the General Data Protection Regulations Policy as proposed by Cllr Toomey. It was acknowledged that as further guidance became available it would be necessary to review policies.

It was agreed that once repairs were carried out, sand and bark should be sourced as proposed by Cllr Cunliffe.

It was unanimously agreed to approve annual membership to National Playing Fields Asoociation (£20/year) as proposed by ClIr Ewing.

Church Letter

From my study window I can see the first snowdrops of the year – a sight which always lifts the spirits. After the long and dark month of January, when the celebrations of Christmas seem but a distant memory, the sight of these charming flowers reminds us of something else to look forward to; the joy of spring.

The tiny apparently fragile snowdrop defies all the odds as it breaks through the frozen earth and its gentle flowers bob in the breeze a bit like flickering candles. The snowdrop or "Galanthus" gets its name from the Greek "Gala" meaning milk and "Anthos" meaning flower. The best way to appreciate their sheer beauty is kneel down and get up close to the flower head which will then reveal its intricacy and amazing variety of patterns.

Worsdworth wrote of the snowdrop:

"Nor will I then thy modest grace forget, Chaste snowdrop, venturous harbinger of spring"

It was the practice in mediaeval times to bring snowdrops into church on the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple as an offering to Our Lady and in Thanksgiving to God for the approach of spring hence the snowdrop has also been called the Candlemass Bell.


Surely all signs of new life, whether it be at the end of a long winter or more generally throughout the year, should fill us all with a sense of thanksgiving. Whatever our belief we should pause to marvel at the wonderful and unfailing cycle of nature of which we ourselves are but a part.

Do pause to reflect this spring and, if you are quick, there is no better place to do it than the churchyard of St Nicholas' Twyford where the snowdrops in all their delicate abundance create a sense of awe and wonder.

If you cannot make it to Twyford then simply pause and look out of your window; in every garden and hedgerow there is something to lift the spirits and remind us of God's amazing creativity.


