CPRE Norfolk Alliance

CPRE Norfolk is our county branch of the Campaign to Protect Rural England. With so much countryside in Norfolk there is always plenty to do in trying to ensure development is appropriate to its proposed location, as well as other aspects such as protecting our dark skies and tranquillity. Having said this, CPRE Norfolk is not against development per se, as we appreciate the need for more housing in particular, especially when it's meeting real need, such as that for affordable homes in villages, enabling local people to live near their families and employment, or for example for retired residents wanting to downsize.

Across Norfolk our Local Authorities have Local Plans in place which have already allocated sites for sufficient new housing, given current and historic build rates, to last for over 20 more years of construction, and yet many more sites are being added into new and emerging plans. CPRE Norfolk's calling for a common sense approach to be used for these new sites, which is for these only to be built-out once the vast majority of sites in existing plans are completed. This will mean that the most appropriate sites will be built first, providing homes where they are more needed, rather than allowing more of our precious countryside's greenfield sites to be lost to unnecessary development. This is more likely to happen as developers understandably prefer to build on sites which will give them the highest returns, which often means attractive rural sites. Instead, we urge Councils to adopt policies which ensure that existing sites are built out first, thus denying the opportunity to cherry-pick the most profitable sites, which are not likely to provide the homes which are most needed in the most suitable locations.

This approach has already gained the support of 142 Parish and Town Councils across Norfolk, as they have signed a pledge to this effect. With threats of unplanned development increasing, particularly when Councils are unable to demonstrate a 5 year supply of land for housing, as well as those new sites coming on stream in the emerging Local Plans, we hope that more Parish and Town Councils will sign our pledge.

Book Club "After the Fire, A Still Small Voice" by Evie Wyled



Frank and Leon are two men from different times, discovering that sometimes all you learn from your parents' mistakes is how to make different ones of your own. Set on Australia's east cost the book describes a wild and sinister world where unexpressed anger continually bubbles under the surface to be expressed violently at times in domestic abuse and wartime atrocities.

Frank is trying to escape his troubled past by running away to a deserted beach shack previously occupied by his grandparents who had committed suicide years ago on the nearby beach. As he struggles to make friends with his neighbours and their precocious young daughter Sal he discovers the community has fresh wounds of its own.

Decades earlier, Leon tries to hold together his family's cake shop as their suburban life is broken apart following his father's return from the Korean War. Shattered by his memories of his time in Korea, his father's behaviour becomes increasingly bizarre until he abandons the family and is followed some time later by Leon's mother in search of her husband. When war breaks out again, Leon must go from sculpting sugar figurines to killing young men as a conscript in the Vietnam war.

Dealing with the difficult issues of loss, abandonment and the inability of some men to verbalise their fears and frustration, some members of the Book Group did not find it an easy read and it certainly engendered a mixed and somewhat negative reception. The characters in the story were almost universally disliked but as is often the case, this dislike engendered much comment and discussion. Nevertheless, this was acknowledged by some members as an accomplished first novel by Evie Wyld.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "A Night on the Orient Express" by Veronica Henry for discussion at our meeting on 3rd May and will read "Nora Webster" by Colm Toibin for discussion on 7th June.

PROPOSAL: Change of use of outbuilding into holiday accommodation LOCATION: Old Workhouse Paddocks, Reepham Road, Bawdeswell,

The Council unanimously agreed to object to this application. It was acknowledged that conditions set in the original planning application in 2001 were not adhered to. Highways have made submission acknowledging that the visual splays initially requested in 2001 have not been provided (and recognise they cannot be provided). The development is outside the settlement boundary. There was concern that by permitting this it would set a precedent for other developments with a long term view of obtaining full residential permission.





Church Letter

Dear Friends,

"Cast ne'er a clout 'til May be out". This seems very wise advice this year, after such a long and dismal winter. In our Benefice (The Heart of Norfolk Team) it has been particularly dismal, with the loss of so many people who have been key in the lives of our communities, and we, collectively, as well as individually, mourn their deaths.

In the same period, the Church has experienced Holy Week and Easter – the time when we enter into Christ's Passion, his death and resurrection, and we are called again to think about our own mortal existence.

And so we ask ourselves: are we living life to the full? Are we making the best use of the time that we have? These are questions I ask myself in my quieter moments.

I'm not sure whether the 'May' of the proverb relates to the month of May or to the Hawthorn, which, of course, produces its blooms in May. What I do know is that the may heralds the true start of Spring: new life in our gardens and on our farms.

Driving back from Brisley to North Elmham two days ago, I saw new-born lambs in the fields and my heart leapt for joy. One of our church-wardens, and his wife, have just taken on four ewes, who were also lambing this Easter season – two lambs arriving on Easter Eve, whist they were in Church.

And so, it seems, from the terrible experience of death, new life arises. This is the tension that we live with, the experience we share, and – hopefully – represents the love we have for one-another, as we comfort each other in our grief and loss and look forward to better times.
