Janet Stewart 1922-2018

Sandi and Robin Taylor would like to thank all those who sent them cards and messages of condolence on the death of Sandi's mother, Janet Stewart, on 28th September. Janet moved to Bawdeswell eight years ago from Scotland to be near family. She was made to feel very welcome and very much at home by everyone around her. The last year and a half she has lived at Hill Barn in Sparham where she has been looked after lovingly and caringly by the staff there. Thank you all.

Proposed New Town

There has been much press coverage, rumour and speculation regarding plans to build a new town consisting of 10,000 dwellings in and around the North Elmham area. This has already caused worry to many people living in the areas affected, including Bawdeswell and Foxley. The situation at present is that the decision to agree to this proposed development will be made by Central Government in Westminster, this is unlike a normal planning application. However, current rules are that Central Government will not consent to the proposed 10,000 dwellings without the agreement of the local authority, in this case Breckland Council.

By the time this edition of The Reeve's Tale is published, Breckland Council will have debated the matter on October 25th, and they may possibly have come to a decision. However, we understand that the applicants - Landpro - will attempt to convince Central Government that, in this particular case, Breckland's consent is not necessary.

Bawdeswell Parish Council has three of its councillors, Ken Ewing, Anni Hartley-Walder and myself on an action group comprising of all Parish Councils in the area. Together, Campaign Against the New Town (CANT) will do all in its power to fight this totally unacceptable development in our countryside.

I am grateful to all those who have written letters of objection to Breckland regarding this development and to all who have signed the online petition.

I will keep you informed of developments.





The author really gets into Maud's mind, accurately describing her frustrations in dealing with this terrible condition, the effects on her daily life and that of her family.

Options to provide additional car parking space

It was reported that residents responsible for the funding and planning of the basketball court were happy for the court to be used for additional parking. Three quotes were obtained for the work. Clerk reported on the meeting she had earlier in the week with Sovereign Playgrounds re refurbishing deteriorating play equipment which included advice re refurbishing basketball court to maximise recreational use.

Other options to provide additional parking were suggested and financial constraints acknowledged. Clerk highlighted annual budget allocation for driveway and current lack of financial provision for the proposed scheme. It was agreed by majority that the car park be extended in principle to join basketball court subject to further financial consideration.

To receive information re Mile Stone and approve further action

The Mile Stone Appreciation Society contacted the Council re Bawdeswell Mile Stone refurbishment. A contribution from the PC of £150 was suggested. Following a site meeting, the offer to refurbish was withdrawn. Letter to be sent to Norfolk County Council highlighting damaged Mile Stone and enquiring about repair/consider carrying out repairs locally. The historical importance was recognised.

Maintenance of Church yard and approval of tree survey quote

Church wall – for repointing and replacing worn bricks it was estimated to cost around £2,000. Further quotes/information to be obtained. PC accepted quote of £245 for tree survey which was agreed unanimously.

Project for Parish Partnership Funding

An email was sent to Highways requesting response/costing for extension to 20MPH zone outside the school. Clerk to chase as no response received.

Street lighting proposal - Two Fields Way

It was confirmed that the PC do not want street lighting in Two Fields Way and are not willing to cover the cost of any additional street lighting.

Foxley Parish Council Meeting held on 11th October

Foxley Wood Steve Collin, Reserves Manager for Woods and Heaths for Norfolk Wildlife Trust, addressed the meeting about possible future developments at Foxley Wood. The Trust wants to put inert stone chippings on the nature trail to keep people on the track and avoid them trampling the vegetation and compacting the soil. The trust also wants to harden the top of the seasonal car park, renew the information panel and improve signage within the site and at the entry and exit points. Natural England has been consulted and approve. The Trust will apply for funding to BIFFA, but want a letter of support from the Parish Council.

All in agreement: clerk to write letter to BIFFA outlining the council's support.

Bus Shelters: They have been erected and in use. Westcotec were able to install them ahead of schedule because of the very dry, hot summer. The provision of a disabled access point at the bus stop on the east side of the road is an ongoing issue. Robert Pratt, Senior Travel & Transport Officer (Information & Infrastructure), Travel & Transport Services, came out to inspect the site in August and has agreed to provide the disabled access point when funding becomes available. Clerk to provide a basic timetable for the shelter on the west side of the A1067. No decision was made about what is to happen to the old bus shelter. Clerk to consult the school transport providers who use that site.

Church Letter

Dear Friends,

By the time you read this I will have been with my wife and friends to see a performer called Ralph Mctell at the Princess theatre in Hunstanton. Those of you of mature years like myself may recall the name. At his shows he invariably says that he has made a nearly 50 year career from one hit song. That song was called "The Streets of London".

The song is among other things a series of questions such as one that starts "Have you seen the old man in a closed down market?" and its chorus, "So how can you tell me you're lonely,

Don't say for you that the sun don't shine.


Let me take you by the hand and lead you through the streets of London I'll show you something to make you change your mind.

To me it is an indictment of a society that fails to look outside itself and take note of what is happening around it. Not noticing those who are less fortunate. It is, of course, set in a big city but I wonder how many of us even in our smaller communities are aware of those same type of people. It also says to me that when I feel I've been dealt a bad hand, I need to look about me.

November is the last month of autumn and also the last month of the Christian year. 
