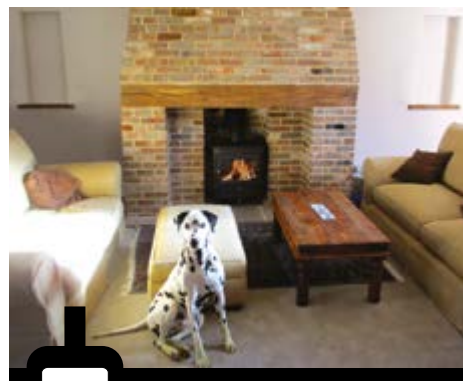

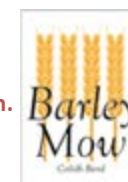

As the nights seem to be drawing in more quickly it is getting harder to remember what a beautiful summer we have had, although the gardens and the grass, perhaps didn't enjoy it as much. We'd like to thank all the volunteers and families who helped run our afternoon café during the school holidays. We must have sold more ice creams and ice pops than we've ever done before. And grateful thanks to Breckland's sports coaches who organised and ran the exciting games for the children on Tuesday afternoons. Bawdeswell can now boast that Quidditch was played here!

We held our Annual General Meeting in August, and were pleased to welcome representatives from many of the groups who use our Hall. The following snippets give an indication of our year, but further information, including minutes from our meetings can be found at:

www.bawdeswellvillagehall.co.uk/meetings-of-trustees

- Our income for the year was £28,700, up £3,500 on the previous year.
- Profit after expenses but before depreciation was £8,100, down £800 on the previous year.
- The trustees have continued to invest during the year which included the new external storage facility "The Beach Hut", a new commercial oven in the kitchen, general decorating, along with a number of other improvements and our general running maintenance programme, which keeps the building in tip top condition for our users.
- Running expenses have increased slightly now with the hall being used more on the previous year.

The trustees are very keen to find someone who could act as our lead on the general maintenance and smooth running of the halls infrastructure, like the water, heating, plumbing, alarm system etc. Someone who could be a 'go to' when we have faults and could co-ordinate repairs and annual maintenance checks with our approved suppliers. We need someone with a 'flair' and understanding of this type of mechanical plant and equipment. If you would be interested in helping us out, or you would like further details please do contact one of the trustees, we would be delighted to hear from you.

In September we enjoyed our second 'Opera at the Hall'. We enjoyed the filmed live performance from La Scala, Milan of Madama Butterfly. A real taste of Italy, prosecco included!

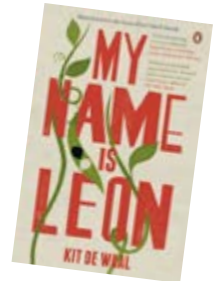

"My Name is Leon" by Kit De Waal



The 2nd April 1980 in a maternity ward, 8 year old Leon holds his new born baby brother, Jake, whilst his mother Carol goes outside for a cigarette. We subsequently learn from Leon's narration that his Caribbean father is serving a prison sentence and Jake is the result of Leon's mother's affair with a married man who has abandoned her. This moving and harrowing tale takes the reader through the process of Carol's decline into clinical depression, and Leon and Jake's move to live with a foster parent Maureen.

Maureen feeds and looks after them and claims everything will be okay. But will they ever see their mother again? Who are the couple who secretly visit Jake? Between the street violence and the street parties, Leon must find a way to reunite his family...

The book group members enjoyed the book a great deal but felt for Leon's plight and frustration at feeling unheard by the adults in his life.

Book Club

"The Report" by Jessica Francis Kane



This book was inspired by real events in London during the Second World War. The scene is set at Bethnal Green Tube Station, which was used as a shelter from the air raids. The date is 3rd March, 1943 and during that night 173 civilians died in the space of a few minutes. Yet, no bombs fell that night, so what caused their deaths?

A private investigation took place, 80 witnesses were interviewed and a report was written. However, this was suppressed by the Government for decades. This true story is interspersed with fictional characters who provide the feelings of the time. A plaque was later laid at the tube Station to commemorate the disaster.

The Book Club members were split in their views, some regarding it as excellent, whilst others were less impressed. Most liked the factual elements of the book, which was unknown to everyone. In fact, it could have proved a more interesting story without the fictional characters, although they did provide certain feelings, such as, survivors' guilt, suicide and responsibility,

What surprised most of us, was the hatred of the Jews in London at that time. Considering what they were escaping from in Europe, it was felt they would have been shown more compassion. The disaster was also compared to the more recent Hillsborough and Grenfell Tower tragedies.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "Elizabeth is Missing" by Emma Healey for discussion at our meeting on 4th October and will read "Exposure" by Helen Dunmore for discussion on 1st November. Happy reading! The September meeting was dominated by planning matters

3PL/2018/0993/F

PROPOSAL: Residential development of 40 No. units (20% affordable) comprising a mix of housing types, accommodating open space and appropriate associated infrastructure with vehicle access via Hall Road

LOCATION: Land off Hall Road, Bawdeswell

A presentation was received from the Managing Director of Abel Homes. A new application has been submitted. Changes made to the original application were highlighted. The level of affordable housing will reduce to 20% reportedly due to reduced financial viability of the site, a viability report has been submitted.

Concern was expressed about the main road on the site ending in a 'turning head', suggesting future plans to build into the adjoining field. It was confirmed this turning head was due to tanker accessing pumping station and that additional sites were not on the agenda at present.

There was discussion regarding the proposed two open spaces. It was hoped that full ownership would pass to either Breckland DC or Bawdeswell PC with title deeds and sum to maintain open space in perpetuity.

It was confirmed there was no other way of accessing the site, but that developer would ensure that existing roadways remained clean/tidy.

Concern was expressed by one resident over the proximity of development to their property, increased traffic movement, especially at junction with A1067 and potential noise pollution from increased traffic. Drainage concerns were also raised. Developer agreed to discuss further with concerned resident.

It was confirmed that there was no allocation for self-build properties.

Although delivery of scheme would depend on sales of housing, it was hoped that the site would be fully developed in about 18 months.

North Elmham PC have already been actively fighting the proposal and will be forming a committee to oppose development. It was agreed that Cllrs Cunliffe, Ewing and Hartley-Walder would attend these committee meetings with members from other PCs to ensure Bawdeswell were represented in future discussions.

Finance

The balance of the Parish Council's Community account after invoices for September were paid is £9,092.41 and the balance of the Business money manager was £2,250.67. Project Bawdeswell account remained as £1,894.28.

The Trust does a great job in maintaining redundant churches many of which are listed buildings and part of our heritage. Half of the money collected comes back to our own church in the village and is earmarked in our case towards the maintenance of the cemetery.

And thank you to our only cyclists this year, Ken and Jane Ewing and their son William. They visited 16 churches. We had visitors from Sparham, Gressenhall, Foulsham, Woking, Brisley and Stibbard.

On Friday September 14th we were visited by Bishop Graham on his final pilgrimage around the Diocese before retirement. He prayed in our church and then went to the Village Hall where he was entertained with afternoon tea by the volunteers there. We thank them warmly for their welcome and their hospitality.

In October we look forward to the Harvest Supper and Quiz being organised by the Friends of the Church. Details elsewhere in this magazine. A feast awaits and tickets are selling fast!

Our Harvest Festival Service is on Sunday 21st October at 10.30am. Any contributions of dried or tinned food will be donated to the Dereham Food Bank. Do join us if you can.

Church Letter

Dear Friends,

It feels very strange to be going into October, and the prospect of winter, after such a long, hot and dry summer. When the weather is hot, I can't quite remember being cold, and when it's cold, I can't imagine being in flip-flops and shorts! But don't we love discussing the weather?

October is traditionally the month when the Church holds its Harvest Festivals, giving thanks to God for our produce and his blessing on our land, crops and our animals. I wonder, though, how many farmers will struggle to feed their animals in the months ahead, as they have already had to draw on winter-feed, given the paucity of grazing this summer? It's going to be tough for them and will undoubtedly work its way into pricing as they will have to supplement the feed.

Whilst we give thanks for our produce, we are also painfully aware that too many people in this country are hungry.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, recently addressed the Trade Union Congress, criticising the Government's policy of Universal Benefits, saying that this leads people into poverty and to being hungry, depending on Food Banks to provide their most basic needs. How can we, in 21st century England, be in a situation where people don't have enough to eat? Archbishop Welby has been criticised by some for entering the political debate – but, as he pointed out, 'the bible is political from one end to the other' and Jesus himself was highly political.

I think that is why we, as clergy, are sometimes called to enter the political debate. We are privileged to have a voice in our communities, especially in times of local need.

Do please continue to support our local Food Banks, and to pray for all those in need. And let us not be afraid to 'get political' and write to our local MPs about issues that concern us. From my past experience, they do listen.
