Myself and Morgan are running the London Marathon for The British Heart Foundation. We chose this Charity because of their work towards HEART DISEASE, STROKE, DIABETES AND VASCULAR DEMENTIA. The Legend that is Andy Battley, lives with all these ailments.

For those that do not know, Shirley and Andy Battley owned and ran the Bawdeswell Store from 1987 to 2007. They are parents and Grandparents to Fel and Morgan.

The London Marathon is 26.2 miles long and is now rescheduled for Sunday October 4th.

So back in the day, Dad would regularly walk his dog Meg, down Common Lane. He could talk for hours (if anyone would listen) about all sorts of things - Politics being his favourite. He would drive between the villages delivering newspapers, groceries and even prescriptions from the Dr's surgery. It was because of him you can now get your tablets from the village store - he set that up. He used to love a cooked breakfast or an ale on occasion. He would be up at the crack of dawn for the Newspapers and still be working at the 10pm closing time. He would do anything for anybody - sponsoring the School football team, and the original New Village Hall, he was Chair of the Parish Council and Head of Governors at the Primary School. He knew EVERYONE in the village, and was infamous himself.

These days he cannot walk at all and has to be hoisted. Occasionally he struggles to recognise me. He has a regular supply of many different tablets and antibiotics to keep him going. He has a smaller diet of moist almost pureed food (to avoid choking) which has to be fed to him, he's awake for less hours than most of us sleep. Of all the challenges he faces, it is the Dementia that strips him of his basic functions, dignity, and personality. Throughout it all, mum continues to be by his side 24/7 doing everything for him.





Into the future, if all goes to plan, we are delighted to welcome Aspire PE back during the Easter holidays to run their sports afternoons as part of **The Breckland Holiday Activities Programme Easter 2020.**



Book Club

"A Man Called Ove" by Frederik Backman



I suppose the first thing is to cope with this man's name. As this book is translated from Swedish, we had to take some linguistic advice, and apparently Ove should be pronounced Ooo-ve. Now we've sorted that, we can talk about the book.

The book was suggested following a recommendation from a book club member over a year ago, when she received it in our 'secret Santa' book exchange. She said it had made her think a lot about what went on in peoples' lives; things that you just don't know, and this book had given her a flavour of what people might be dealing with, whilst just showing the world a "grumpy" face.

Initially, this book is about a man who is very orderly, has everything in its place. He follows rules. And he constantly checks that others follow rules too. Some of our group gave up reading about this very grumpy man. However, those who read on, discovered a very different man. All those who continued reading became intensely interested in Ove, and very concerned about his life.

Without giving too much away (because I hope you might read this book one day), we learn that Ove is a man who has loved very deeply, he cares about others and those around him can love him too. The book has many characters. They interact with Ove, helping us to unravel his past and understand how and why he reacts as he does.

A general description of this book could be that it is a 'Black Comedy'. Some of his interactions, especially those with the family next door, a scene in a shop as he tries to buy an iPad, helping with driving lessons are very funny whilst the unveiling of his history conveys real sadness.

In a nutshell this book is about Rules and Order; Memories and Grief; Principles, Fairness and Loyalty and especially about Love of one's Family and Community. It's worth a read.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading *"Normal People" by Sally Rooney* for discussion at our meeting on 2nd April. Our next book will be *"The Chalk Pit" by Elly Griffiths* for discussion on 7th May. With no funds the members led by Jimmy Turner and Philip Dufield mostly through holding disco in the parish room making over £200 pounds and with membership increasing very quickly more games were needed. So by the end of 1986 we had a balance of £438, by the start of 1987 the membership increased to 25 + and under the captaincy of Paul Digby the team won Elmham league and cup double. The chairman was Paul Digby the sec and treasure was Irvin Wright for many years. By the end of 1990 the bank balance was £975, with the green being small the opportunity came to sell the green and parish room for housing and lay a new green on the recreation ground behind the village hall The sale of the green and parish room made £45000; the bowls club received 36.44%. The estimate for a new green was £17106. So on the 17th August 1992 work started on the new green by Nigel Curtis.

Following discussions between Bawdeswell Parish Council and our Community Car Scheme, it has been agreed that the CCS should extend its services to include the collection of medication from local surgeries and for essential foodstuffs from local shops/supermarkets to be delivered to the doorstep of those who have either contracted the virus or who are 'isolated'.

This service will only be provided to those who have no other means of collection and will be offered just for the duration of the isolation. The CCS is manned by volunteers from both Bawdeswell and Foxley, so this additional service will be available to residents of both villages.

At the moment it is anticipated that the payment for the service will be the same as a normal CCS journey, which is 20p per mile. The situation regarding payment for medicines and foodstuffs will be arranged at the time of booking.

All our volunteer drivers have agreed to participate in the plan and we have had a number of offers of help from younger members of our community who, even if they are not drivers, have offered to dog walk, collect library books, and generally help in any way they can. We are extremely grateful to every one of them.

In order that the service can be monitored, all requests for assistance should be made to **Bill & Jackie Cunliffe 01362 688956.** We will try to keep everyone up to date by Email but if you do not have that facility we will put regular notices in McColls at Bawdeswell.

MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 5th MARCH 2020

Present: B.Cunliffe (Chair), J. Mallen, K. Ewing, A. Toomey and R. Reed, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk). Members of the public – 0.

County Councillor B. Borrett, District Councillor G. Bambridge and the Police were not in attendance.

Football Club electricity supply / flood lights

Plans to install floodlights was on hold as the football pitch is currently too wet to play on. It was reported that the Football Club were going to make further enquiries with Breckland Planning in the summer in preparation for the autumn / winter.

Village Hall Car Park

Following complaints that the village hall car park floods in some areas and that there is often not enough car parking spaces, ClIr Cunliffe proposed a working group, including village hall trustees, be formed in order to investigate / discuss the matter further. It was acknowledged that a plan to finance any improvements would be required.

Concern was expressed about the poor visibility turning out of the Village Hall. A highway 'mirror' placed opposite the Village Hall entrance was suggested as a measure to provide additional visibility. It was agreed that ClIr Cunliffe would make further enquiries.

Recreation Ground

Plans for the new play equipment were approved and it is anticipated that they will be installed after Easter. Thanks were extended for generous donations received which has enabled the play equipment to be installed.

Finance

The balance of the Community Account after February's invoices was £13,569.60, Business Money Manager was £2257.53, Project Bawdeswell account was confirmed as £ £3,331.90 (ring-fenced funds for play equipment). The Parish Council would like to express their gratitude to the Friends of Bawdeswell Church for their contribution of £1040 towards repairs carried out on the Church wall.

Other matters

There were no planning applications for consideration.

The Parish Council would like to express their gratitude to the Saga Louts for the successful litter pick. Concern was raised about the current location of the Post Box due to the increased level of inconsiderate parking on The Street. Cllr Cunliffe to investigate other locations for the Post Box.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Thursday 2nd April 2020 starting at 7.30pm in Bawdeswell Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend.
