**Happy New Year**. We're looking forward to spring, but we're guessing we might have a few more dark months first.

Unsurprisingly the Hall was quiet over the Christmas period but we were very pleased when we totted up all the uses and hirers that the Hall has fulfilled during the year. We have had **787** hires during 2019, that's **67 more** than in the previous year. Bookings have been varied from meetings for 2 to 120 people; local family celebrations for birthday parties, anniversaries as well as, sadly, wakes. We've also looked after a myriad of different groups from a national gardening society, nature groups, a ploughing society, a regional model train exhibition to WI meetings. And we're delighted that we have so many happy customers as shown by the people and groups who are returning to book and use our facilities.

We know that we must keep the hall in good condition, because this is part of its appeal but comments from our hirers indicate that they also appreciate the welcome they receive and the help given by all our volunteers and we feel this is reflected in how well our hirers treat the hall. We've said it before, but it can never be too many times, many thanks to all our volunteers who contribute so much to the running of our village hall. We do recognise that we might be wearing some folks out a bit and are keen to widen our list of volunteers. As the months roll on we intend to continue our plans to update our charitable status including looking further at our governance structure which we started at our last 'open consultation' meeting (21/11/19).



Book Club "All the Light We cannot See" by Anthony Doerr



This novel divided the book group: some loved it; some were less keen and at 530 pages some felt that it was too long. It is the Pulitzer Prize winning story of two teenagers: the blind Marie-Laure who is involved with the French Resistance and the German orphan Werner who through his ability to mend radios is brought to the attention of the Hitler Youth and then the German army. However, it is not a clichéd love story and there is no happy ending for the two of them together. Their only intimacy is the sharing of a tin of peaches before Werner tries to ensure that Marie-Laure will reach safety and then leaves for his own eventual death.

The style of the novel is complex, with a time line working back and forth between the start and duration of World War II and the dual narratives of Marie-Laure and Werner. Some in the group felt that the short chapters and disjointed narrative of the writing often with cliff-hanging chapters, gave it a "soap-opera" feel while others felt that the fast-pace pulled them forward as events unfurled. Some did not like the occasional Americanisms of the language which it was felt was anachronistic and showed carelessness on the part of the author and editorial staff. However, it was also noted that there were some excellent descriptions and the use of symbolism and imagery especially of the spiral motif, were beautifully done and enhanced the level of the writing.

The novel is about the Second World War but it also has an element of magical realism in that there is a large valuable diamond which Marie-Laure's father is entrusted to keep safe and out of German hands. The diamond has a legend attached to it and it is only when the novel is complete that the reader understands how this has been played out. To preserve the diamond as the Nazis advance and for their own safety Marie-Laure and her father flee to St Malo and it is here that they are involved with the Resistance. The importance of radio communication during the war and the bravery of those broadcasting under Nazi occupation is one aspect of the War that Doerr explores. Nazi atrocities are apparent in the school where Werner is trained and where his friend Frederick is bullied virtually to death. Werner's participation in the Nazi war machine is shown firstly through the quelling of his conscience about Frederick and then his active participation in tracing radio broadcasts: those found are shot.

This novel engendered tremendous discussion among the book group as every-one felt very strongly about it – either for or against. As we talked new aspects of the text were brought to light and a lot of members felt that it was a book which could be read repeatedly. Many felt that this was a deeply rewarding and enjoyable read.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month.

Please note that in order to use the scheme you must be able to walk and get in and out of a car unaided. Please give as much notice as possible as it is difficult to commit a driver to a same/ next day appointment. However, if this is unavoidable we will always do our best to accommodate you. In the unlikely event that you cannot make same day contact with me, please call **Angela Shannon on 01362 688111**.

If you feel you could help the scheme by becoming a driver, please contact me on the above number. You will only be asked to undertake a journey if it is convenient to you and I can assure that our passengers are always extremely grateful!

#### BAWDESWELL, BYLAUGH & FOXLEY COMMUNITY CAR SCHEME IMPORTANT CHANGES

During 2019 there was a massive increase in the use of the Community Car Scheme particularly in the number of visits to the hospital.

It became obvious that it would be impossible to keep within the financial limits agreed with the 2 providers - namely Breckland Council and Bawdeswell Parish Council who share equally the cost of payment to the volunteer drivers.

Accordingly, following consultations and meetings both councils agreed to share the payment of the current increase, but with the proviso that no such undertaking would be provided after the present financial year.

It has therefore been necessary to amend the criteria for accepting requests for car journeys with the scheme. These changes will bring our CCS in line with other similar service providers and ensure that we are compliant with current health and safety regulations.

In order to accept a request for transport the following conditions are now required: \* Transport can only be provided where there is no available *alternative* eg. hospital transport.

\* The scheme is only able to accept requests from passengers who are able to walk and get in and out of a car unaided.

Unfortunately, drivers are no longer able to offer or assist with the use of a wheelchair in any circumstances.

I will continue to do my utmost to accommodate all requests as long as they fulfil the above criteria and I am determined that this scheme will continue to offer a good service to the community.

### BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 5th DECEMBER 2019

Present: B.Cunliffe (Chair), J. Mallen, J. Lilwall, K. Ewing, A Hartley-Walder, R. Reed, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk). Members of the public – 3 County Councillor B. Borrett, District Councillor G. Bambridge and the Police were not in attendance

### Precept requirements for 2020 / 21

The Clerk circulated the financial report / budget. Following discussion it was unanimously agreed to keep the precept at the same level as the current year and request a precept of £24000 for 2020/21.

### To approve agreement with Football Club re electricity supply

A question was raised about whether the Football Club lighting required planning permission. An initial enquiry with Breckland advised that the Council seek official guidance from Planning. Although a draft agreement was circulated for approval and agreed in principle, it was agreed to defer the approval until February when the situation with planning was known. It was agreed to provisionally approve the agreement by email once situation known to avoid unnecessary delay.

### To receive update and approve additional expenditure for Community Car Scheme

Concern was expressed at the unsustainable high level of demand for the Community Car Scheme. Following discussion it was agreed that the Council agree to match fund (with Breckland) the shortfall in Community Car Scheme funding for the remainder for 2019/20 subject to regular users making use of alternative transport available.

As Breckland advised that it was the Parish Council's responsibility to decide how best to manage the scheme, it was agreed that further discussion was necessary to establish parameters for the future management of the car scheme and establish Health and Safety guidelines for drivers. It was acknowledged that the scheme was dependant on the goodwill of the volunteers and Thanks were extended to them and Jackie Cunliffe for her continued efforts in managing the scheme.
