



Celia Joice died on 1st February aged 96.

Celia was born at Maytree Farm in Bawdeswell in 1923 and that has been her home ever since.

She had an older sister Margaret and brother John who died aged 11. Their mother died in giving birth to Celia and they were brought up by two aunts at the farm. The children all attended Bawdeswell Primary School and the girls went on to Grammar School in Dereham, cycling to North Elmham each day and catching a train to and from Dereham.

On leaving school she was required to do war work and she worked in the ticket office of Lenwade railway station, which was a busy station on account of the nearby airfields.

After the war she went to the Royal Academy of Music and became a music teacher, first at Wisbech High School for Girls and then at a high school in Leicester, always returning to Bawdeswell for school holidays.

In her retirement she became organist of Bawdeswell Church and was honoured by the Royal College of Organists.

She was a keen Bridge player and continued to play even after becoming bedridden four years ago. She had a very sharp mind and amazing memory right to the end.

If you are at all interested in helping develop our allotment please do give us a call and we would be happy to show you around.



We continue to have our regular bookings, thank you for continuing to use our hall! And we're delighted to welcome back some of our 'annual conference users' as well as some completely new hirers. We're very fortunate to have such wonderful facilities. These certainly attract our visitors although sometimes our very success causes issues when many people arrive in lots of vehicles. Our car park does have 'accommodation problems', especially in wet conditions when overflow parking on the recreation ground causes huge anxiety for those with rear wheel drive and low confidence. Consequently, we are delighted to learn that the Parish Council is looking into car parking, the drive and capacity issues. As you might imagine, we have our fingers crossed for a great outcome!

One of our targets that came from the discussion at our Community Open Evening in November was for us to have more 'live' events. We were delighted when Bawdeswell Entertainments Group (BEG) arranged with Creative Arts East for a oneman 'live' performance of The Canterbury Tales and we can now share the news that **FEast Theatre**, the rural touring theatre company, will use our Hall in June for one of their 'live' performances. Our previous investment in our stage has been worth it: it's made all the difference in attracting performers and performances.

Over the last few months the architects and the constructors of the roof system have been investigating and meeting together to draw together a report with suggestions for the way forward. This full report has now been received and will be carefully considered by the Trustees.

We would like to thank Bill and Jackie for the wonderful displays of heritage photos that are displayed in our Reception area. They cause a great deal of interest, from local residents and visitors from afar, especially as the viewers try to spot old buildings and, for some, old relatives. The fashions of yesteryear cause some merriment too!





Book Club "Educated" by Tara Westover



This is a true, and somewhat harrowing, account of the writer's upbringing on an isolated Idaho farmstead with her Mormon fundamentalist parents and 6 siblings. Her father was so suspicious of the outside world that the children never attended school, doctors or hospitals. Even their births were not registered so, to the authorities, they simply did not exist. Her father was controlling and abusive and lived his life with the conviction that a catastrophic event would coincide with the stroke of midnight 31 December 1999 Y2K. He prepared his family for this eventuality by storing canned food, fuel and guns ready to run to the safety of the mountains when the "days of abomination" occurred. Each child had a "head for the hills bag" and was aware of their roles when the "event" happened. To them this was normal but to an outsider it's hard to reconcile young children being indoctrinated in this way on a daily basis. Her father ran a scrap yard on the farmstead where his children were expected to work. He had no consideration for the health and safety of his children and the writer provides graphic detail of the horrific accidents suffered while working there, all serious enough to require hospital treatment but instead attended to by her herbalist mother at home. The expectation was that girls would be married by 19 and that their husbands would build a house on a plot of land on the family farm. Against all odds the writer bucked this trend by spending every penny she earned buying the books needed to educate herself. Eventually passing the entrance exam to Brigham Young University followed by Harvard and finally Cambridge where she received a PhD.

I think most of us, once released from such a controlling and abusive environment, would never return but she did, even when studying in the UK, such is the bond which ties a family. In her father's defence she even suggests that he may have been suffering from a form of Bipolar Disorder which she felt accounted for his erratic behaviour. There is no doubt that her life was a struggle and that she was a true survivor.

I was left feeling some of the accounts were a little unbelievable but I also counted my blessings that my upbringing was the complete opposite of her's. However, the book was generally well received by the group with one member declaring it was in their 6 best reads.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "A Man called Ove" by Frederik Backman for discussion at our meeting on 5th March. Our next book will be "Normal People" by Sally **Roonev** for discussion on 2nd April.

Mr H Sills continued as treasurer with Mr P Carter as Secretary and Chairman. The team continued playing in the North Elmham league with 25 Members paying 5 shillings each per year. The Groundsmen D Bailey and H Sills were paid £4 per year. Membership through the war was low, funds were kept going with a whist drive once every two weeks which raised about £5 10s.In 1957 the team won the league for the first time. Team members were J Joyce, D Andrews, D Bailey, L Moy, E Payne, L Ward, W Bushell, W Beck, H Sills, P Carter, S Lambert. Then in 1960 because of low membership they were limited to playing just Saturday evening rollups. This continued till 1985 when a new club was formed.

A meeting was held in the parish room, election of officers were Mr J Turner Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary Mr E Wright and Mr P Digby Captain. So with no money fundraising was a must.



BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 6th FEBRUARY 2020

Present: B.Cunliffe (Chair), J. Mallen, J. Lilwall, K. Ewing, A Hartley-Walder, A. Toomey and R. Reed, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk). Members of the public – 2.

Chairman Bill Cunliffe welcomed Councillor Toomey back after a very serious illness. County Councillor B. Borrett, District Councillor G. Bambridge and the Police were not in attendance.

Football Club electricity supply / flood lights

Breckland District Council Planning suggested that the Football Club lighting would require planning permission, so it was agreed that whilst the PC remained in support of the request for an electricity supply / semi fixed flood lights on the container, the Football Club should seek the required permission before further work could be permitted.

Community Car Scheme

A further grant of £750 was received from Breckland towards the predicted shortfall in Community Car Scheme funding. Given the strain on the demand for the service and Health and Safety concerns, the Parish Council agreed that transport can only be provided where there is no available alternative transport available and that the scheme can only accept requests from passengers who are able to walk and get in and out of a car unaided or who will travel with a companion to help them do so. Drivers are no longer able to offer or assist with the use of a wheelchair in any circumstances.

Planning and development

3PL/2019/1051 - Construction of timber built and timber cladded kennel block at 34 Reepham Road, Bawdeswell, NR10 4RU

The Council agreed with two against, that whilst they had no objection to the building of the kennel, they were concerned that the kennel may be used for commercial ventures.

The appeal against refusal for change of use of outbuilding into holiday accommodation at Old Workhouse Paddocks, Reepham Road, Bawdeswell NR20 4RY has been dismissed

Finance

The balance of the Community Account after January's invoices was £14,381.02, Business Money Manager was £2257.15, Project Bawdeswell account was confirmed as £3,331.90 (ring-fenced funds for play equipment). A cheque for £4598.70 was received from HSBC confirming closure of the Trustee account. The new bank account was in the process of being opened.

Church Letter

Dear Friends,

What a strange winter we've had, weather-wise. As we watched appalling scenes of the bush fires in Australia, with the effects going right across New South Wales and Victoria, we seemed to be having slightly abnormal winter weather here. One Monday in February, the day started bright and sunny, if cold. That was the farewell from Storm Ciara, quickly followed by her brother Dennis! Climate change – or climate emergency – is a phenomenon we clearly cannot ignore.

As Winter turns to Spring, my heart rejoices, seeing the spring flowers pushing their way up through the warming soil and I eagerly wait for the flowers that will come.

The Church season we are now in – Lent – seems to be going in the opposite direction. At Candlemas (2^{nd} February), we turned our backs, finally, on Christmas and the Babe born in Bethlehem, and started to face towards the Cross that we meet powerfully on Good Friday (10^{th} April). We do that knowing that new Life will come again at Easter, when we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and all the promises of new life that He brings to us.

My New Year's resolution this year is to turn my attention to my garden – for my pleasure – but also to improve its potential to attract wildlife and birds. And, perhaps, to do my little bit to improve the environment around me.

Easter Day falls on 12^{th} April – all will be welcome to the services in our churches to join the celebration.
