JASON EDWARD WEBSTER

Jason was born on 25th July 1971 on his Dad's birthday. His birth brought great happiness to us after the sad loss of our first son Simon in 1969, six days before his first birthday. Jason attended Bawdeswell C.P. School, then Reepham High School. At 16 Jason attended Norwich City College and achieved his City and Guilds Qualification in Cabinet Making.

His first job was at Bylaw of Lenwade making reproduction furniture, He was made redundant after 15 years. He immediately started employment at Struik and Hamerslag UK at Fakenham constructing interiors for Super Yachts. He thoroughly enjoyed his work and took great pride in it. Jason was described by the firm as a superb cabinet maker.

Last year Jason was diagnosed with a brain tumour. After a big operation at Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge to remove the tumour, he also had some further treatments. Jason always had a fighting spirit. He never looked back – only forward.

Jason died on 9th July at Priscilla Bacon Lodge. His graveside funeral at Foxley was attended by about 100 people. To date just over £1,000 has been raised in his memory for East Anglias Childrens Hospices.

We would like to thank everyone for their love, kindness and support.

A Case for Drones

Drones and their users are often criticised. The main concern is that they are an invasion of people's privacy.

These days, all users of drones which weigh more than 250 grams must be registered with the Civil Aviation Authority. Before I could become a registered 'pilot' I had to pass an exam comprised of questions relating to the safety of flying and the legal restrictions involved.

I am a keen photographer, and some of my photographs are used for the front cover of The Reeve's Tale and indeed the front cover of this issue was a photo taken by me using my drone.

It was a natural progression for me to want to take photographs from the air.

My drone is a DJI Phantom 3 Professional which can fly at over 30 mph and has a range of about 2 miles. The main feature - for me, is the attached camera capable of taking 4k video and 12mp still photographs.

Drones are now being used by Police Forces in most countries. They can be of great use in searching for missing persons, being able to cover land inaccessible to motor vehicles, and are a cheaper option than helicopters. A tremendous amount of TV programmes use aerial shots for effect. Farmers use them as a quick cheap method of checking on livestock in large fields.

My drone only takes pictures and videos, but these days drones are getting bigger and more sophisticated and can carry emergency medical supplies to remote locations.

When I go out with my camera and telephoto lens there are very few restrictions on what I can photograph. Yet, when I use my drone I'm suddenly subjected to a host of regulations. The cameras may differ but it's the same cameraman just looking for a good picture.

I strictly adhere to the CAA guidelines regarding flying near people and buildings and I am always mindful of nearby children and animals.

So, if you see me with my drone, looking intently at the controller in my hand, please come and have a chat. I'll show you what I'm doing and hopefully convince you it's harmless. Honestly!!

Reepham Rotary aims to raise funds for local charities

Reepham Rotary Club has launched an appeal to support local organisations who have been stretched by the current pandemic. The Reepham Rotary Recovery Initiative aims to help organisations as they get back to work following the recent restrictions on activities.

Members have set up the appeal because traditional fund raising through events has been difficult and the Club has also found that it cannot yet offer practical help in many instances. The initial target is to raise £2,500. £1,000 has already been pledged.

Chairman Tony Williams explains "We have successfully supported regional charities and some overseas projects; however, we are acutely aware of the difficulties that have been felt in our own area. Many people have been badly affected and many organisations have found it difficult to operate and to raise funds. Their activities will be essential as more people need help. Some of us may find we have spare cash since shopping and entertainment have been restricted. This is what started our members thinking about how we can put this to good use. We have spoken to many others in and around Reepham who find themselves in a similar situation and hope that they will join us in building up this fund."

Recovery Initiative grants will be directed to organisations supporting those with needs initially arising from the Corona restrictions. It is hoped that this will become a long-term project providing funds into the future.

Organisations in Reepham and surrounding villages who would like support for a purchase or a project should contact Richard Cooke to discuss their needs. More details will be found on the Club's website.



Elmham Surgery News

Throughout the past months we have tried to keep everyone regularly updated on the activity of the Practice. Covid-19 has presented multiple challenges to everybody and continues to do so at this knife-edged moment of balancing everyone returning to work, schools & universities in a world experiencing a global pandemic.

Throughout the pandemic the Surgeries have never closed, nor have we ever stopped providing any healthcare to our patients. However, care delivery is sometimes different and maintaining a smooth running service is a constant challenge, which we work as a team to overcome.

There are some areas which we recognise as being frustrating to our patients and I will try to address these individually.

"Why can we not access the Surgery or come to see someone?"

People rarely see 'behind the scenes' in any healthcare setting. Whilst every shop, school or business actively prevents people with any symptoms of illness from entering the premises, a clinicians work consists of regular contact with people who are the most unwell. The Doctors and Nurses have to see the sickest and most vulnerable patients, keeping each patient, and themselves, safe.

One of the main ways of controlling this is ensuring we know who is entering the building, when and in which area they are seen in, keeping people separated and safe. We phone people to discuss their symptoms mainly because we can often offer advice and treatment without needing to see everyone, and to co-ordinate the logistics of those that we need to see and physically examine.

We know that each patient we see may potentially have Coronavirus. The risk to the Surgery of an outbreak is staff sickness, the need for isolation and disruption to that service. There is a risk of potential closure of the Practice in the event of an outbreak. We continue to wear full PPE when seeing everyone, we socially distance around the workplace even wearing masks in our offices and we work remotely at times to keep all our patients and staff as safe as possible.

Booking Appointments

General Appointments

We are currently working to 'same day' appointments. Reception will ask for details so they can ensure we get the right person for your care.

There aren't any 'traditional' appointment times, you will be added to the list and a clinician will call you that day.

If you need to be seen you will be asked to attend the surgery after a telephone consultation.

Planned Care

- Cervical Screening

Reception will be glad to clarify if you have any questions.



District Councillor G. Bambridge, County Councillor B. Borrett and the Police were not in attendance.

Grounds Maintenance in Bawdeswell

Followings concerns raised about future maintenance of Adams Pit, Jubilee Garden and other areas around the village, it was suggested that given the uncertainty over the future availability of volunteers and the availability of the current contractor for the Jubilee Garden and Churchyard, the Council should review the situation. It was agreed that there remained a lot of work in and around the village for the Village volunteers /Saga Louts without general grounds maintenance.

It was unanimously agreed to visit all locations to note what is required in terms of maintenance at each location and draft a specification from which quotes for grounds maintenance could be obtained. It was acknowledged that it would be easier to set the precept when costs are known.

Recreation ground

Teenagers in the village have requested more facilities. Suggestions made include a shelter / hut or bike / scooter ramps. Although they were asked to email the Council and put forward ideas for consideration, they had not yet engaged. The Council agreed to consider future projects in principle. No update / report was yet received from the Engineer regarding the specification for village Hall car park extension.

It was with a feeling of shock and sadness that we learnt of the death of William Mason. For more than 10 years William was a valued and active member of the local community.

William and Karin Mason retired to Bawdeswell in 2005. William spent some of his formative years in Norfolk which may have been why he chose Norfolk as a retirement destination. William had enjoyed a career in the city of London working in the banking industry on balance sheet risk management, banking regulation and developments such as the single European currency. He represented banks at all levels of UK and European government. He was a graduate of Cambridge University and had degrees in Mathematics and Law, and also banking qualifications. He also rowed for his college.

He was Vice Chairman of the Parish Council in 2009 and served with distinction till he left the village in 2015.

William was a very able Councillor who, in his very quiet way, gave his all for the village and community. He was someone who could be counted upon in every walk of life. His financial acumen and expertise knew no bounds.

He was a Churchwarden and Treasurer of Bawdeswell PCC, and also the Treasurer of Sparham PCC.

He was the Hon Treasurer of the Norwich Diocesan PlayVan for three years. During his time as Treasurer, he was able to acquire funding for a brand-new van which greatly improved their work. The Trustees very much valued his expertise and the way he successfully managed all their financial affairs.

He was also Treasurer of the Bawdeswell Village Hall committee for many years and importantly through the challenging time of applying for the lottery grant for the new village hall. The funding would not have been secured without his knowledge and understanding of the financial information required.

He was many talented and also had a good voice; he sang with the Iceni choir and read for audio books for the blind.

It was a blow to many when they decided, for Karin's health, to relocate to the warmer climes of Barbados in 2016, and they left after a special 'thank you' party given for them, appropriately in the new hall he had helped to achieve. William kept in touch with us and will be greatly missed by those who knew him. Our sympathies are with Karin at this very sad time.

Church Letter

Church of the Future?

The experience of lock-down and not being able to use our church buildings for over four months has enabled us to reflect on what it means to be *Church*, whilst we have been gathering virtually via Zoom.

For some, of course, church buildings are interesting places to visit and they tend to generate quite deep affection among local residents. For those of us who consider ourselves as part of the regular worshipping community, it's so much more than this.

"Church" is not really about our buildings, however much we love them; it's not about individual parishes and how they fit into the bigger scheme of things; it's not even about where or how we choose to worship. It's about God and sharing his love in our communities, and he must be our focus as we move forward.

One thing we have experienced during our Zoom worship is much larger congregations: 50-60 people week-by-week. Coming together as a virtual community has been deeply rewarding and enjoyable, even though we couldn't sing together, which many of us missed enormously.

So, where do we go from here? What we are not going to do is to revert to the old 'normal' with tiny congregations struggling to keep their churches open.

So, how do we grow; how do we make progress? That is a question not just for us as individuals, but for our church communities; for the Heart of Norfolk Group as a whole. Growth often leads to new challenges; to fresh struggle and to deeper learning.

We are planning those big church occasions coming up: Harvest Festivals, Remembrance Sunday, Christmas services. We are having to plan based on current Covid-19 restrictions but hope and pray that we can welcome any who want to come. However, some of these services may have to be 'ticketed' events, to manage social-distancing and the safety of all who attend.


